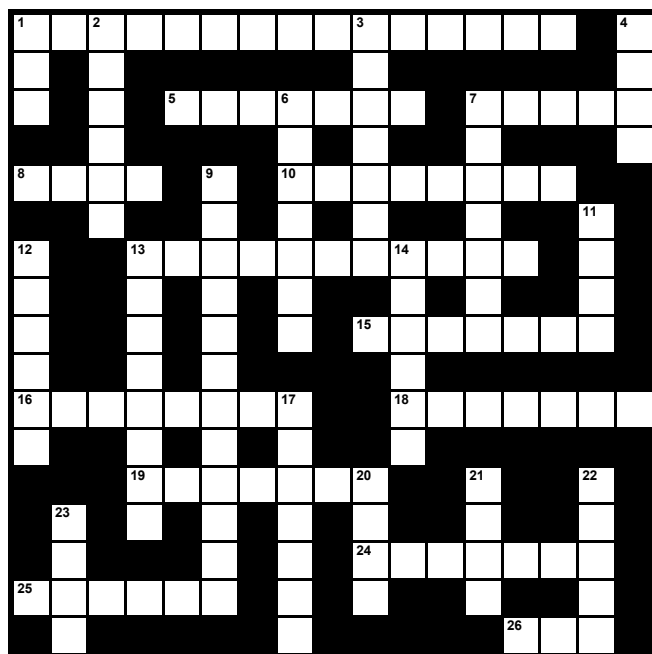

- 10 Moving from the center of the ship to the side of the ship. (8)
- 13 A pilot's seat in an airplane that can be forcibly ejected in the case of an emergency. (7,4)
- 15 A tactical warning and control system aircraft of USA. (7)
- 16 A device that launches aircraft from a warship. (8)
- 18 Armament consisting of a long cylindrical self-propelled underwater projectile that detonates on contact with a target. (7)
- 19 On a ship. (7)
- 24 Heavy duty helmet. (7)
- 25 An upper deck where a ship is steered and the captain stands. (6)
- 26 Front part of a vessel or aircraft. (3)
- 3 Someone who operates an aircraft. (7)
- 4 Come to the ground at the end of flight. (4)
- 6 The catapult officer aboard a carrier. (7)
- 7 A twin-engine helicopter of USA primarily used to attack enemy submarines and in search-and-rescue operations. (7)
- 9 The propeller shafts are rotated by the XXXXX XXXXXXXX that is powered by nuclear reactor. (5,7)
- 11 A front that resembles a human nose (especially the front of an aircraft). (4)
- 12 Take off an aircraft. (6)
- 13 Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically. (8)

- 2 Steering mechanism consisting of a hinged vertical plate mounted at the stern
