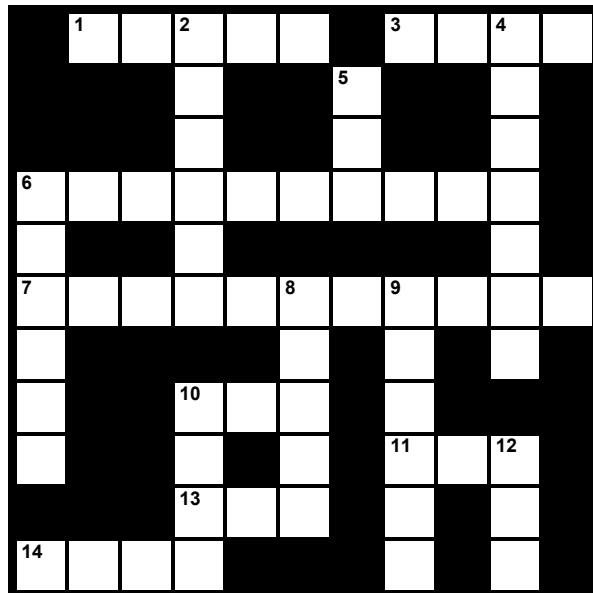

- 6 A multi-electrode valve which controls the flow of electrons in a vacuum from electrode to electrode. (6,4)
- 7 Electro-acoustic transducer that converts electrical

signals into sounds loud enough to be heard at a distance. (11)

- 10 Name for the set of minimum technical standards for movie soundtracks derived from Tomlinson Holman's eXperiment. (3)
- 11 A digital display that uses liquid crystal cells that change reflectivity in an applied electric field. (3)
