- 4 Large African antelope having a head with horns like an ox and a long tufted tail; a.k.a. wildebeest. (3)
- 5 Any of various freshwater fish of the family Cyprinidae. (4)
- 7 A fish-eating water animal with smooth dark brown fur and webbed feet that is related to weasels and minks. (5)
- 9 Waste matter (as urine, sweat but esp. feces) discharged from the body. (7)
- 10 Stages of development of living organism. (4,5)
- 12 Any of numerous carnivorous birds that hunt and kill other animals. (4,2,4)

14 Sit on eggs. (8)

- 15 Stingless male bee in a colony of social bees (especially honeybees) whose sole function is to mate with the queen. (5)
- 16 The smallest fish. (5,4)
- 20 Man-made dwelling for bees. (4)
- 23 Carnivorous or bloodsucking aquatic or terrestrial worms typically having a sucker at each end. (5)

- 1 Mostly white web-footed tropical seabird often found far from land. (10)
- 3 Having warm blood (in animals whose body temperature is internally regulated). (4-7)
- 4 Tallest living quadruped. (7)
- 5 Pig-sized tailless South American amphibious rodent with partly webbed feet; largest living rodent. (8)
- 6 Sound made by oystercatcher. (4)
- 8 A vast treeless plain in the arctic regions between the ice cap and the tree line. (6)
- 10 A compact and sturdy

saddle horse that is bred and trained in Vienna; smart and docile and excellent for dressage. (10)

- 11 Mollusk with a low conical shell. (6)
- 13 Any immature animal. (5)
- 17 Parasitic flatworms having external suckers for attaching to a host. (5)
- 18 Nocturnal bird of prey with hawk-like beak and claws and large head with front-facing eyes. (3)
- 19 Any of various small plant-sucking insects; a.k.a. plant louse. (5)
- 20 Swift timid long-eared mammal larger than a

rabbit having a divided upper lip and long hind legs. (4)

- 21 A small rodent similar to a mouse but with a shorter tail and legs and a stocky body. (4)
- 22 Large Australian flightless bird similar to the ostrich but smaller. (3)
- 24 Thin-shelled reproductive body laid by e.g. female birds. (3)
