

Across

- 1 A white cloth placed on the ground as a marker for long distance shooting. (5)
- 2 A rearward turned point on an arrow head. (4)
- 5 An arrow which has missed it's target, Japan. (5)
- 8 A large bow, Japan. (6)
- 9 The place where an arrows nock is drawn to before release, usually the chin, cheek, ear or chest. Used to help aiming. (11)
- 11 A projectile weapon consisting of a shaft with the two ends joined by a string used to shoot arrows. (3)
- 12 To string a bow. (5)
- 13 A recurve bow made

from a number of materials laminated together (eg. wood, sinew and horn). (12)

- 17 The missile shot by an archer from a bow. (5)
- 18 An arrow which is thickest in the middle and tapers to the ends. (9)
- 21 The wooden shaft of an arrow. (5)
- 22 A modern bow with flat section limbs made from fibreglass and wood laminations, often referred to as a longbow. (7)

Down

- 1 The string of a Bhil bow (kamptu), Central India. Both bow and string were made of bamboo. (6)
- 3 A maker of bows. (6)

4 Allowing the arrow to edge forward at full draw just before the release of the arrow. (5)

- 6 A bow made from hazel, 11th century. (8)
- 7 The measurement of the distance from the grip to the string of a bow, usually measured by placing a fist on the grip with the thumb extended towards the bowstring. (8)

10 A hook on the belt of a crossbowmen used to draw the string on the crossbow. The crossbow was held by putting the foot in a stirrup at the front and the claw was hooked on the string as the crossbowmen was bending over, as the crossbowmen straightened up the

string was drawn into position behind the nut. (4)

- 11 Archery targets. (8)
- 13 The poison used on arrows and blow pipe darts in South America. (6)
- 14 The body of an arrow. (5)
- 15 An arrow, Central India. (3)
- 16 A small bow used by children to shoot fish, Nicobar Islands. (3)
- 19 One of the arms of a bow, from grip to tip. (4)
- 20 The act of bending the bow to full arrow length by drawing the string backwards while holding the bow steady. (4)
