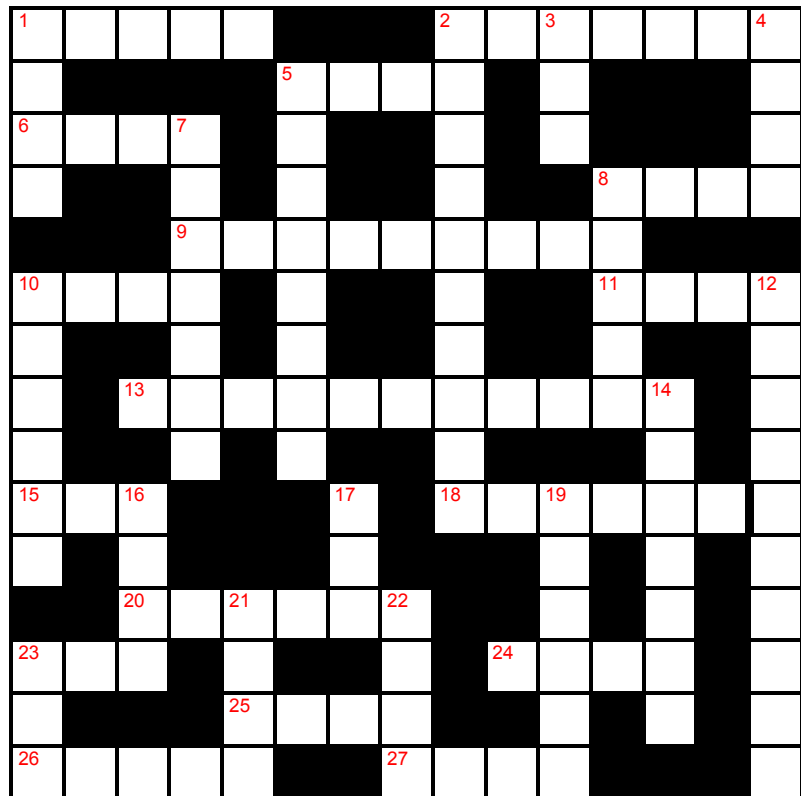

- 1 A steep high face of rock. (5)
- 2 A large body of ice moving slowly down a slope or valley or spreading outward on a land surface. (7)
- 5 A boggy area of wasteland usually peaty and dominated by grasses and sedges. (4)
- 6 The location in a range of mountains of a geological formation that is lower than the surrounding peaks. (4)
- 8 Any of the sides of a river. (4)
- 9 A large mass of land projecting into a body of water. (9)
- 10 A steep descent in a waterway, usually caused by large rocks, where the water drops rapidly. (4)
- 11 A narrow strip of land that juts out into the sea. (4)



- 13 The totality of surrounding conditions. (11)
- 15 Plant juices. (3)
- 18 A narrow channel of the sea joining two larger bodies of water. (6)
- 20 A sweet fluid produced in flowers. (6)
- 23 The bottom of a waterway. (3)
- 24 A considerable inland body of standing water. (4)
- 25 A long depression in the surface of the land that usually contains a river. (4)
- 26 A narrow pass (especially one between mountains). (5)

stream that can be forded. (4)

- 1 A point or extension of land jutting out into water as a projecting point. (4)
- 2 Land where grass or grasslike vegetation grows and is the dominant form of plant life. (10)
- 3 It covers the entire earth's surface. (3)
- 4 A lump or mass of hard consolidated mineral matter. (4)
- 5 A landmass that projects conspicuously above its surroundings and is higher than a hill. (8)

- 8 The entire geographical area drained by a river and its tributaries. (5)
- 10 A dense grove of trees and underbrush covering a large tract. (6)
