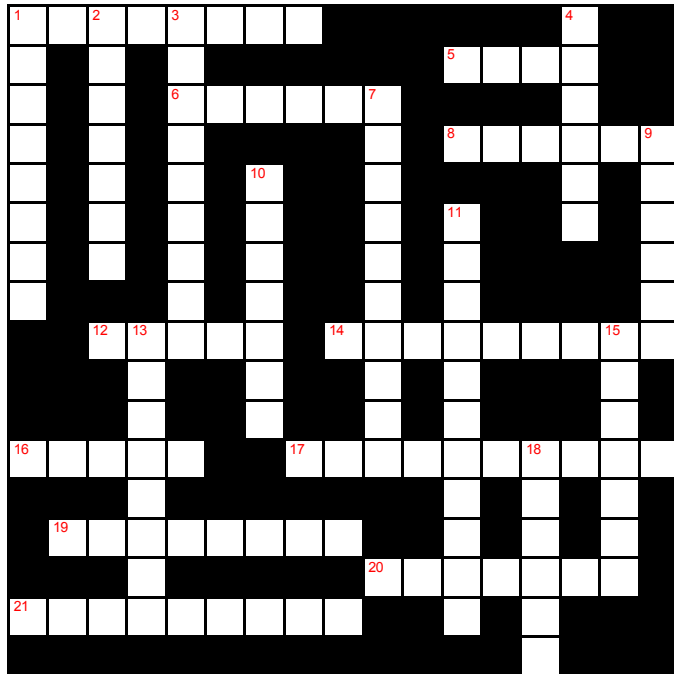

- 1 A game closely resembling baseball that is played on a smaller diamond and with a ball that is larger and softer. (8)
- 5 A sport adapted from jujitsu (using principles of not resisting) and similar to wrestling; developed in Japan. (4)
- 6 An athletic competition that involves headlong plunge into water. (6)
- 8 A quick run. (6)
- 12 Small and light boat; pointed at both ends; propelled with a paddle. (5)
- 14 A contest between athletes. (9)

- 16 A small canoe consisting of a light frame made watertight with animal skins; used by Eskimos. (5)
- 17 A game played on a court by two opposing teams of 5 players; points are scored by throwing the basketball through an elevated horizontal hoop. (10)
- 19 Travel through water as a sport. (8)
- 20 Riding in a sailboat as sport. (7)
- 21 The sport of hand-to-hand struggle between unarmed contestants who try to throw each other down. (9)

- 1 The act of firing a projectile. (8)
- 2 Fight with fencing swords. (7)
- 3 A game played on a court with light long-handled rackets used to volley a shuttlecock over a net. (9)
- 4 The act of propelling with oars as a sport. (6)
- 7 A sport that involves exercises intended to display strength and balance and agility. (10)
- 9 A game played with rackets by two or four players who hit a ball back and forth over a net that divides the court. (6)

- 10 The sport of shooting arrows with a bow. (7)
- 11 A game (trade name Ping-Pong) resembling tennis but played on a table with paddles and a light hollow ball. (5,6)
- 13 Sports that involve bodies of water. (8)
- 15 The sport of traveling on a bicycle. (7)
- 18 Fighting with the fists. (6)
