

- 3 The horny protuberance at the juncture of the head and upper bill in African and Chinese Geese. (4)
- 5 The hollow stem of a feather. (5)

- 7 A colloquial term for any breed of poultry. (4)
- 8 A tightly folded; slim, tapering, whip-like tail. (4,4)
- 11 The fleshy red crest on the head of the domestic fowl and other gallinaceous birds. (4)
- 13 Filled with vascular sinuses and capable of becoming distended and rigid as the result of being filled with blood. (9)
- 14 The long stiff wing feathers growing from the middle wing segments, next to the primaries. (11)
- 18 The skull and face. (4)
- 21 Limb including the upper and lower thigh and shank. (3)
- 24 A young domestic cock; not older than one year. (8)
- 25 Adult male chicken. (4)
- 26 Small wild or domesticated web-footed broad-billed swimming bird usually having a depressed body and short legs. (4)
