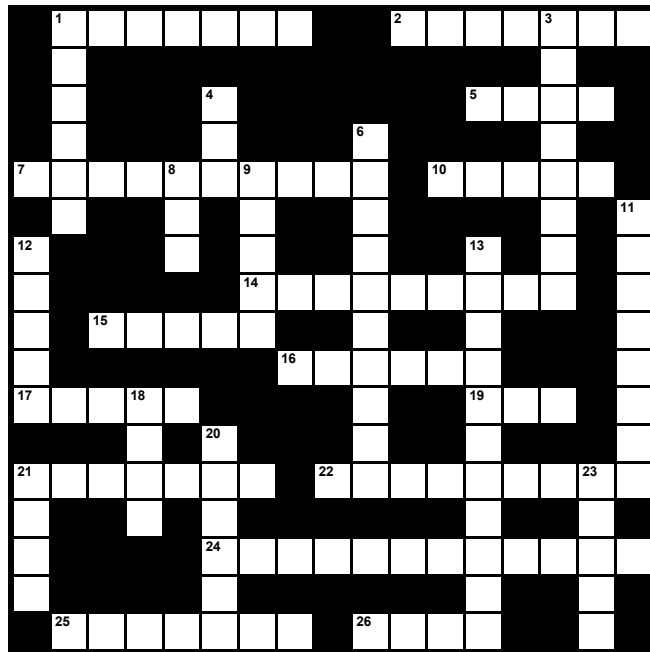

- 1 An arrow that is shot from a crossbow. (7)
- 2 To loose the string to launch the arrow. (7)
- 5 Part of the bow from the handle to the tip. (4)
- 7 A hole above the grip that allows the archer to shoot through the centre of the bow. (6-4)
- 10 The pattern of arrows shot on target during an end. (5)
- 14 Driving the tip of an arrow into the end of another arrow that's already in the target. (5,4)
- 15 A optical instrument for aiding the eye in aiming. (5)
- 16 The force in pounds

required to pull the bowstring by 28 inches. (6)

- 17 A certain number of arrows, shot from established distances, in competition. A round is made up of ends. (5)
- 19 The end loop of a bow string. (3)
- 21 Bending of the bow to place the string in position. (7)
- 22 A bow that has sights. Also, competition conducted with such bows. (9)
- 24 An arrow hanging down from the target disc. (7,5)
- 25 A bow whose tips curve away from the archer. (7)
- 26 Straw disk behind the target face. (4)

Down

- 1 A case for carrying arrows. (6)
- 3 A device for protection of bow arm from abrasion by the string. (8)
- 4 A sudden jerky motion in the bow after release. (3)
- 6 A counter-balancing weight mounted on a bow to minimize jerk of the bow string upon release. (10)
- 8 A group of arrows before being retrieved from the target and scored. (3)
- 9 The part of the target outside the scoring area. (5)
- 11 The gold center circle on a target. (5-3)

- 12 The bow's handle. (5)

- 13 A shaft having a hardwood section on its front end. (6,5)

- 18 An attachment for placing arrow on the string. (4)

- 20 The location on the face touching the fingers of the archer while at full draw. (6)

- 21 The side of the bow farthest from the archer. (4)

- 23 To release. (5)
