

- 2 Archery equipment. (6)
- 6 A piece of leather that protects the string fingers. (6,3)
- 8 The part of the target outside the scoring area. (5)
- 9 A group of arrows that are shot before being retrieved from the target and scored. Usually six, sometimes three. (3)
- 10 A case for holding arrows. (6)
- 11 To release. (5)
- 12 A device on the bow that allows the archer

to take aim on the target. (5)

- 13 The gold center circle on a target. (5-3)
- 16 An end in which the archer shoots all bulls-eyes. (7,3)
- 19 Bending the bow to place the string in the notches. (7)
- 20 A certain number of arrows, shot from established distances, in competition. (5)
- 21 Straw disk behind the target face. (4)

Down

- 1 The bow's handle. (5)
- 3 The end loop of a bow string. (3)
- 4 A crossbow arrow. (7)
- 5 The side of the bow farthest from the archer. (4)
- 6 A bow that has sights. Also, competition conducted with such bows. (9)
- 7 The feat of driving the tip of an arrow into the end of another arrow that's already in the target. (5,4)
- 8 A bow made of a single piece of wood. (4,3)
- 14 A wrapping of thread that prevents wear on the bowstring. (7)
- 15 The number of pounds of force required to pull the bowstring back 28 inches. (6)
- 17 An attachment that holds the arrow in place on the bow string. As a verb, to place the arrow on the string. (4)
- 18 Lack of smooth action in the bow after release. (3)
