- 9 The side of the bow farthest from the archer. (4)
- 11 As per International Archery Foundation Rules, a round of 144 arrows, with 36 shot each from four distances. (4,5)
- 12 Slight forward movement of the arrow point before release. (8)
- 13 An attachment for placing arrow on the string. (4)
- 15 A group of arrows before being retrieved from the target and scored. (3)
- 16 The feather placed at right angles to the string at the time of nocking of the arrow. (4,7)
- 19 A certain number of arrows, shot from established distances, in competition. A round is made up of ends. (5)
- 20 An arrow with over-sized feathers, used in bird hunting. (3-3)
- 21 The force in pounds required to pull the bowstring by 28 inches. (6)
- 22 The gold center circle on a target. (5-3)
- 23 The location on the

- 2 Part of the bow from the handle to the tip. (4)
- 3 A bow made of a single piece of wood. (4,3)
- 4 Straw disk behind the target face. (4)
- 5 A counter-balancing
- 6 Bending of the bow to place the string in position. (7)
- 7 A measure of bow stiffness. (5)
- 8 A shaft having a hardwood section on its front end. (6,5)
- 10 Archery equipment. (6)
- 11 A piece of leather that protects the fingers from string wear. (6,3)
- 14 The side of the bow nearest the archer. (5)
- 16 A hole above the grip that allows the archer to shoot through the centre of the bow. (6-4)
- 17 A bow that has sights. Also, competition conducted with such bows. (9)
- 18 A device for protection of bow arm from abrasion by the string. (8)
- 19 To loose the string to launch the arrow. (7)
- 24 The bow's handle. (5)
