

- 1 The main central playing area of the cricket ground (22 yards long and 10 feet wide). (5)
- 3 A situation when the tenth batsman of the batting team gets out. (3,3)
- 6 Leg guard. (3)
- 8 The material used for marking the boundary of the field. (5)
- 10 Nickname of Sir Donald Bradman. (3)
- 12 Fieldin position close to the boundary. (4)

**14** A delivery by the bowler. (4)

**15** An Australian term for googly. (5)

**16** Prefix to fielding positions that are shorter than the short. (5)

**17** The horizontal distance travelled by the ball from bowler to the ground where it pitches. (6)

### Down

**2** Overpitched ball which the batsman can reach hit off the front foot easily. (4-6)

**4** Fielding position on the boundary. (4)

**5** A fielding position behind the wicket and close to the axis of the pitch. (4)

**7** The ball that is not counted as part of the over. (4,4)

**9** Unintended contact of the ball with bat's edge, which might result into a catch at slips.

**11** Line marking off the positions of the bowler and batter. (6)

**13** A fielding position on off side square of wicket. (5)

**15** Run scored when a ball moves away without touching batsman's bat or his body. (3)
