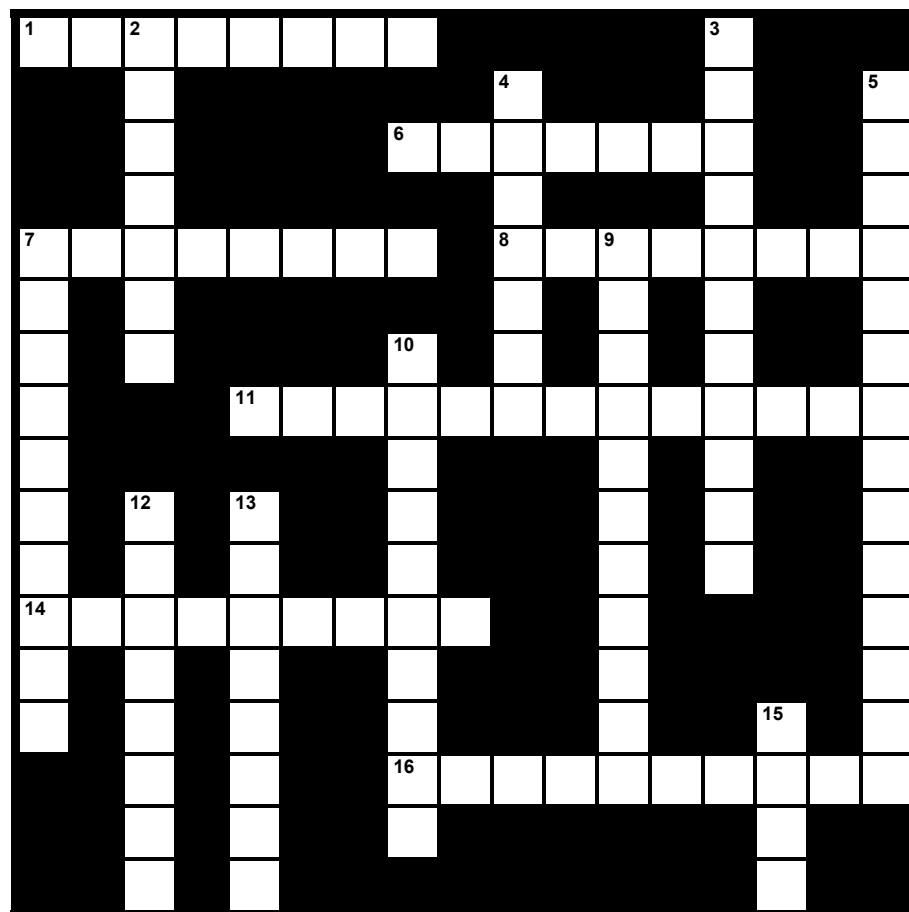

Across

- 1 A throw from the centre line to a team-mate at least three metres away and behind the line, used to restart play. (5-3)
- 6 A throw from the side of the court to restart play after the ball has gone over the sidelines. (5-2)
- 7 The D-shaped area extending six metres from the goal and occupied only by the goalkeeper. (4,4)
- 8 Also called the "outer goal line". (4,4)
- 11 An arcing dotted line extending nine metres

from the goal, marking where an attacking team resumes play after being fouled inside the line; also called the "free-throw line". (4-5,4)

- 14 A player centred largely around midcourt who directs the offence and shoots or tries to penetrate the defence; also called a "centre back". (9)
- 16 A line across the court dividing it into two halves. (6,4)

Down

- 2 A card signifying a referee has ejected a player from the game. (3,4)
- 3 A one-metre line seven metres in front of the goal where penalty throws are attempted; also called the "seven-metre line". (7,4)
- 4 To move the ball by bouncing and re-bouncing it on the floor. (7)
- 5 A one-metre line seven metres in front of the goal where penalty throws are attempted; also called the "penalty

line". (5-5,4)

- 7 The player in charge of defending the goal. (10)
- 9 Also known as a "field player". (5,6)
- 10 Also called a "playmaker". (6,4)
- 12 The line the ball must cross to score a goal. (4,4)
- 13 A shot released at the high point of a jump. (4,4)
- 15 A player who plays largely along the side of the court. (4)
