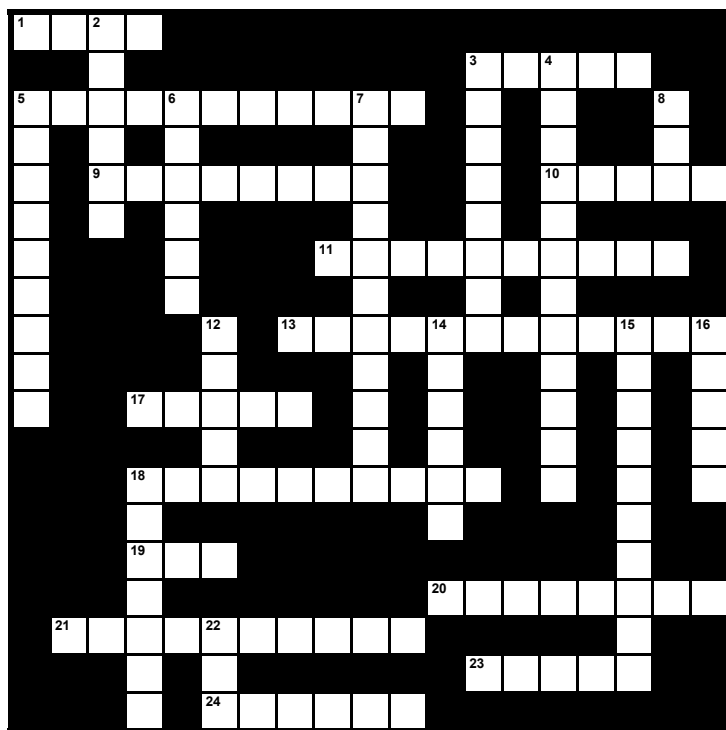

- 1 Descriptive slang for forearm passing. (4)
- 3 The combination of one, two or three players jumping in front of the opposing spiker and contacting the spiked ball with the hands. (5)
- 5 To contact the ball at a level below the waist using the forearms as the contact surface. (7,4)
- 9 Also called "hitter" and "spiker." (8)
- 10 Length of the court in feet. (5)
- 11 The original name of the game of volleyball. (10)
- 13 A ball-handling skill using both hands simultaneously to contact the ball above the head and direct it to the intended target. (8,4)

- 17 The field of play. (5)

- 18 Area 2 metres wide surrounding the court. (6,4)
- 19 Slang for the art of retrieving an attacked ball close to the floor. (3)
- 20 A line 30 feet away and parallel to the net on each of its sides. (4,4)
- 21 An individual shot directed at an angle from one end of the offensive team's side of the net to the opposite sideline of the defensive team's court. (5-5)
- 23 Putting the ball into play. (5)
- 24 Width of the court in feet. (6)

- 2 Last name of William G., the inventor of Volleyball game. (6)
- 3 Area between attack line and back line. (4,4)
- 4 Any ball spiked with less than maximum force but with spin. (3-5,4)
- 5 The area between centre line and attack line. (5,4)
- 6 Attempt to hit the ball to the floor on the opponent's side. (6)
- 7 An area of 10 feet by 10 feet on right side behind each back line. (7,4)
- 8 Also called "spike" or "attack." (3)
- 12 A ball that is deflected back to the attacking team's floor by the opponent's blockers. (5)

- 14 Also called "spiker" or "attacker." (6)
- 15 A line parallel to and 10 feet from the net. (6,4)
- 16 Also hit or attack. (5)
- 18 Occurs when the receiving team successfully puts the ball away against the serving team, or when the serving team commits an unforced error, and the receiving team thus gains the right to serve. (4-3)
- 22 The tactical skill in which a ball is directed to a point where a player can spike it into the opponent's court. (3)
