

- 1 A pass from one player to another, that lands in the water. (3,4)
- 5 A race for the ball in the centre of the field of play to start each period. (4-3)
- 8 To lift or carry the ball. (4)
- 10 The time between the whistle for a foul and the restarting of play. (4,4)
- 11 A defensive strategy where players are positioned between the ball and the players they are guarding. (4,5)
- 13 A 20-second situation for the offensive team where it plays with

one more player than the defence after a defensive player commits an exclusion foul. (3-2)

- 14 To hinder the movement of a player not in possession of the ball. (9)
- 16 An infringement by a player that leads to the referee awarding possession of the ball to the opposing team. (8,4)
- 17 Main attacking player, who takes position directly in front of the opponent's goal; also known as the hole man. (6-7)

Down

- 1 A quick wrist shot attempted while the ball is controlled in the water. (3,4)
- 2 To push a player under the water during a tackle. (4)
- 3 When the play is on. (4,4)
- 4 A foul by a defensive player inside the four-metre line directly aimed at preventing a goal. (4-5,4)
- 6 Preventing the hole set from receiving a pass. (5)
- 7 Main attacking player, who takes position directly in front of the opponent's goal between the two-
- metre and four-metre lines. (4,3)
- 9 A foul called for holding the ball underwater. (4,5)
- 10 A defensive strategy in which the players drop back to protect the centre of the pool and help block shots. (4)
- 12 An ordinary foul for a team's failure to advance the ball within 35 seconds. (8)
- 15 The position on offence that is farthest from the goal. (5)
