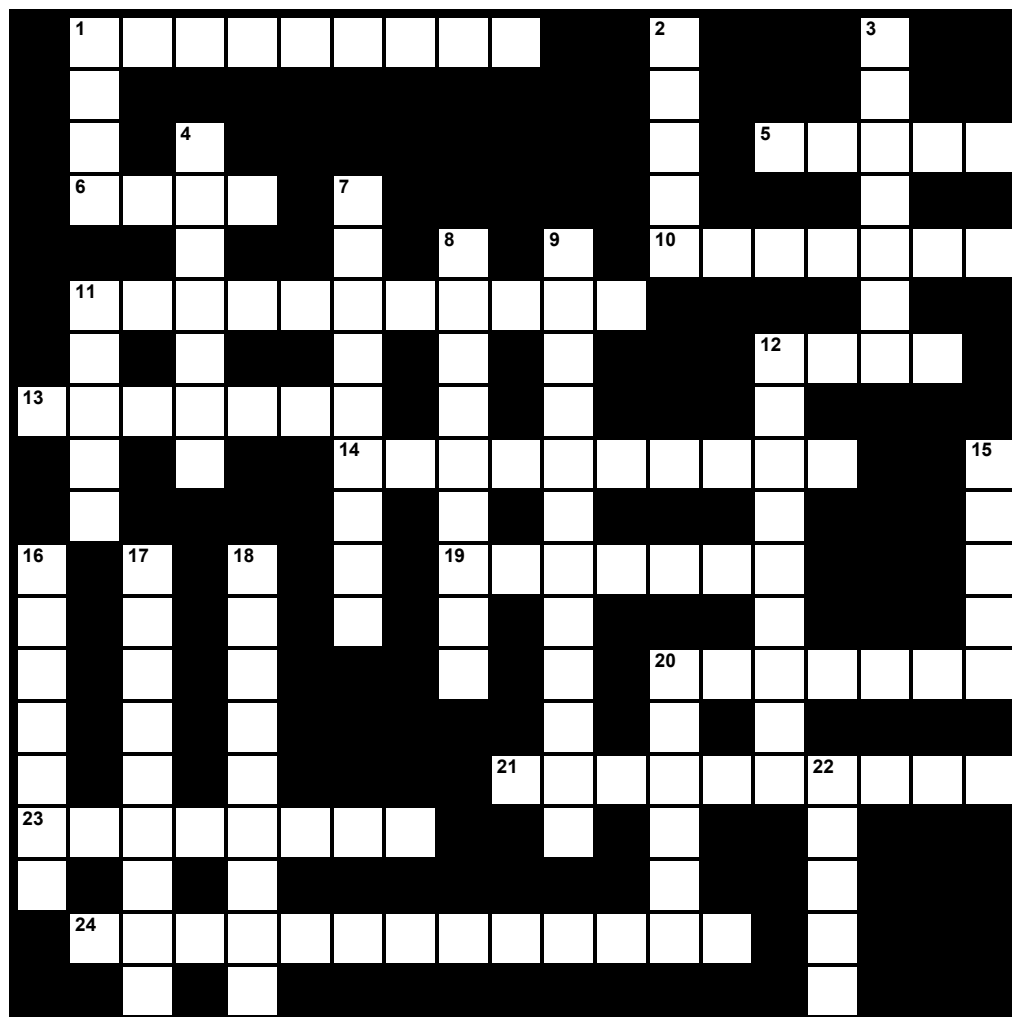

<b>20</b> To swim with the ball. (7)	<b>3</b> A 20-second situation for the defensive team where it plays with one less player than the offence after a defensive player commits an exclusion foul. (3-4)	<b>15</b> To swim quickly to the front of the goal without the ball. (5)
<b>21</b> A move by an offensive player to swim in front of a player defending another offensive player, freeing that team-mate for a pass or shot . (6,4)	<b>4</b> Main attacking player, who takes position directly in front of the opponent's goal between the two- metre and four- metre lines; also known as the centre-forward, or two-metre man. (4,3)	<b>16</b> A pass from one player to another, that lands in the water. (3,4)
<b>23</b> An ordinary foul for a team's failure to advance the ball within 35 seconds. (8)	<b>7</b> To hinder the movement of a player not in possession of the ball. (9)	<b>17</b> The alternating leg kick used to tread water and lift players vertically out of the water. (9)
<b>24</b> Main attacking player, who takes position directly in front of the opponent's goal between the two-metre and four-metre lines; also known as the hole man, hole set or two- metre man. (6-7)	<b>8</b> A foul called for holding the ball underwater. (4,5)	<b>18</b> Dangerously rough play. (9)
