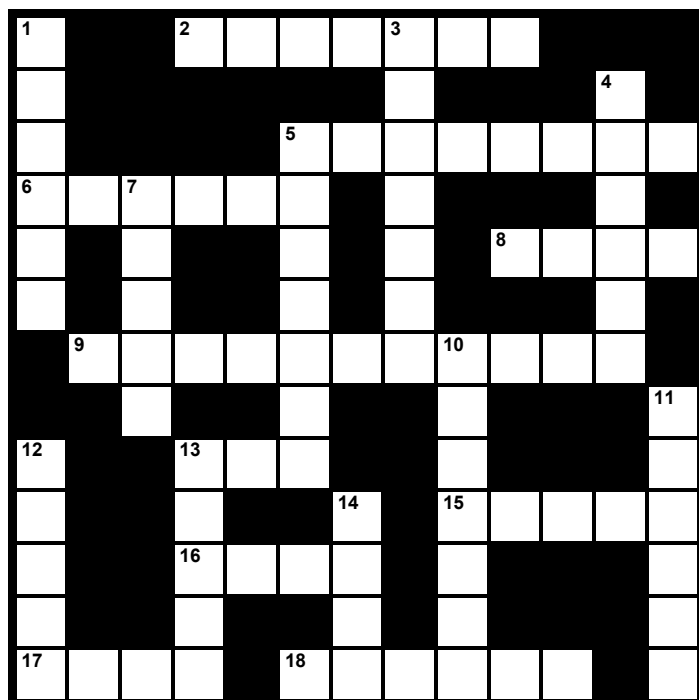

- 2 A clothing fabric in a plaid weave. (7)
- 5 A lightweight fabric woven with white threads across a coloured warp. (8)
- 6 A medium-weight, closely-woven fabric with a thick pile; resembles velvet, but has a lower cut pile. (6)
- 8 It is soft, strong, absorbent and has a brilliant sheen and is considered as one of the finest textiles. It is also very strong and absorbent. (4)
- 9 Fabric made to look like leather. (11)
- 13 An open fabric, which is created by connecting the

intersections in a woven, knitted, or crocheted construction to form a mesh-like appearance. (3)

- 15 A smooth fabric of silk or rayon; has a glossy face and a dull back. (5)
- 16 A delicate decorative fabric woven in an open web of symmetrical patterns. (4)
- 17 A thin sheer linen or cotton fabric, plain or printed. Pre-shrunk, crisp and crease resistant. (4)
- 18 A brightly printed and glazed cotton fabric. (6)

Down

- 1 A silky densely piled fabric with a plain back. (6)
- 3 Interwoven yarns of mixed colours producing muted greyish shades with flecks of colour. (7)
- 4 A ribbed soft and glossy woven fabric of silk or rayon or cotton. (6)
- 5 Make a piece of needlework by interlocking and looping thread with a hooked needle. (7)
- 7 A fabric woven with fibers from the flax plant. (5)
- 10 A protein that is similar to collagen and is the chief constituent of elastic

fibers. (7)

- 11 Heavy closely woven fabric (used for clothing or chairs or sails or tents). (6)
- 12 A weave used to produce the effect of parallel diagonal ribs. (5)
- 13 The first completely synthetic fiber ever developed; known for its high strength and excellent resilience. (5)
- 14 An open fabric of string or rope or wire woven together at regular intervals. (4)
