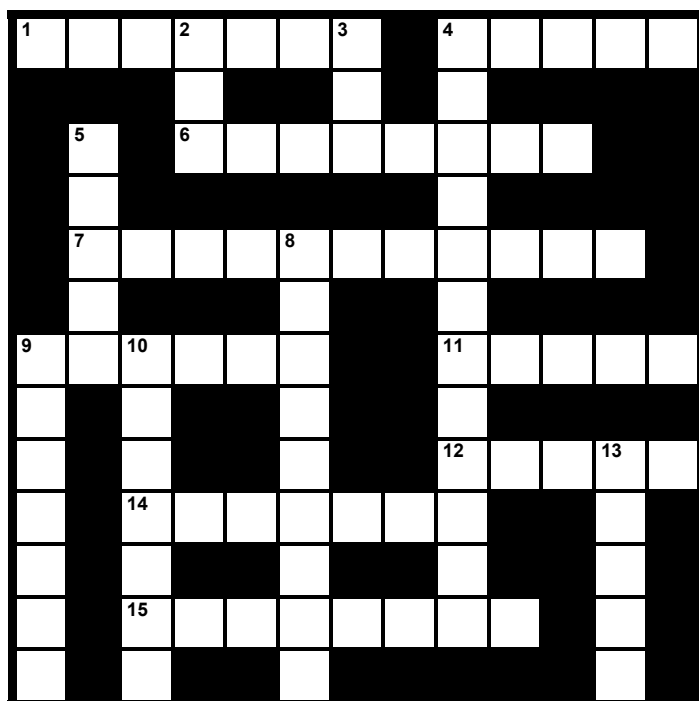

- 12 A compound in which the hydrogen atoms of a hydrocarbon have been replaced by bromine and other halogen atoms. (5)
- 14 Simple combustible hydrocarbon. The major component of natural gas. (7)
