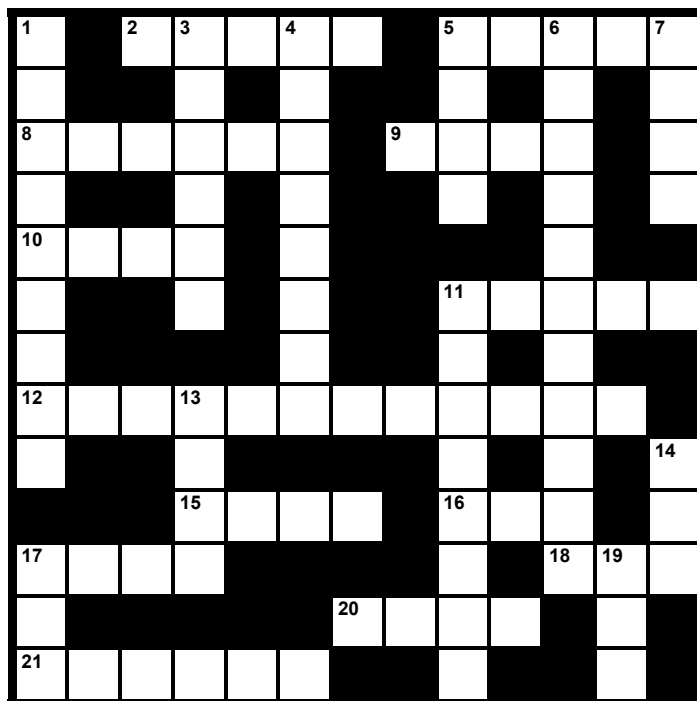

### Across

- 2 A defensive shot with no intention to score. ( 5)
- 5 Measure of performance of the batting side in terms of runs made by losing a number of wickets in an innings. ( 5)
- 8 A substitute player provided for the batsman to run between the wickets in his place for scoring runs. ( 6)
- 9 When the umpire calls it a day and removes the bails from stumps. ( 4)
- 10 First class match, generally of 5 days duration. ( 4)
- 11 A shot with a straight bat and being in line with the ball. ( 5)

- 12 A difficult to play under-prepared and uneven uneven pitch. ( 7,5)
- 15 Fielding position on the boundary. ( 4)
- 16 Run scored when a ball moves away without touching batsman's bat or his body. ( 3)
- 17 An indication, by signalling and by voice, from the batsman to his partner whether to take a run or not. ( 4)
- 18 Nickname of Sir Donald Bradman. ( 3)
- 20 Leave the field when out without waiting umpire's signal. ( 4)
- 21 With proper XXXXXXXX, even a gentle push will

send the ball rolling to the boundary. ( 6)

- 1 Another nomenclature for Cabbage patch. ( 4,5)
- 3 The horizontal distance travelled by the ball from bowler to the ground where it pitches. ( 6)
- 4 An opener who is said to be "XXXXXXXXX his bat" when all ten of his teammates are out but he survives. ( 8)
- 5 A fielding position behind the wicket on the off side. ( 4)
- 6 A ball with a length that compels the batsman to play forward. ( 11)

- 7 Unintended contact of the ball with bat's edge, which might result into a catch at slips. ( 4)
- 11 The ball that is not counted as part of the over. ( 4,4)
- 13 A delivery by the bowler. ( 4)
- 14 Basic unit of scoring. ( 3)
- 17 A back foot shot with cross bat towards square or behind the wicket on the off side. ( 3)
- 19 No more allowed to continue to bat. ( 3)
