

### Across

- 1 A ball thrown far away from the batsman (4)
- 4 Fielding position towards the bowler's left for a right-handed batsman (3,4)
- 7 A ball that turns from off to leg for a right-handed batsman (3-5)
- 9 When a new batsman following the one declared out takes more than 2 minutes to come to field; can be declared out (5,3)
- 10 A defensive shot with no intention to score (5)



- 12 Opposite of off side (2,4)
- 13 Unintended contact of the ball with bat's edge, which might result into a catch at slips (4)
- 14 A poor quality bat (5)
- 15 Stitches around the equator of a cricket ball (4)
- 16 A shot taken on back foot with cross bat and directed into the sector between long-leg and mid-on (4)
- 18 Three vertical sticks holding two horizontal bails (6)
- 20 Nickname of Sir Donald Bradman (3)
- 24 An off-break bowled with an

- action akin to that for the leg-break (6)
- 25 A batting shot (6)
- 26 Basic unit of scoring (3)
- 27 Runs scored when a ball moves away without touching batsman's bat or his body (4)
- 28 Headress of the umpire inevitably and of players occasionally (3)

- 3 A ball that has no bounce after pitching and thus very difficult to handle by the

- 11 The two batsmen who come first for batting (7)
- 12 A delivery that moves in the air away from a right-handed batsman (10)
- 14 To let the ball to hit the pad while batting (3,2)
- 16 Leg guard (3)

- 17 Risky shot played by pulling the ball that is chest high or more (4)
- 18 Prefix to fielding positions that are shorter than the short (5)
- 19 The main central playing area of the cricket ground (22 yards long and 10 feet wide) (5)
- 21 Series of consecutive 6 balls bowled by a single bowler (4)
- 22 Footwear that covers the whole foot and lower leg (4)
