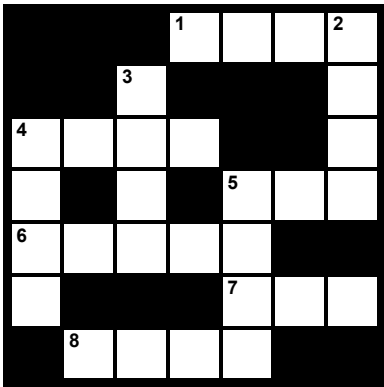

Across

1 In fencing, a sharp tap on an opponent's blade to initiate or threaten an attack. (4)

4 A contest in its entirety between two fencers. (4)

5 1. A target that has been hit and broken by the shooter. 2. In fencing, a point scored by a touch with the tip of the blade of a foil or epee or the edge of the blade of a sabre against any part of the opponent's body in the target. (3)

6 The basic attack in fencing where a fencer closes the distance with his or her opponent by moving the front leg forward while the back leg remains stationary and

straightens out. (5)

7 A prompt that a rider gives a horse, using the hands, legs, voice or body weight. (3)

8 Any of a horse's characteristic motions, including, in order of speed, a walk, trot, canter or gallop. (4)

4 The black centre ring of the target, worth 10 points; also known as "bullseye". (4)

5 An early race of an event, with the top finishers advancing to the finals or semi-finals of the competition. (4)

2 An easy gait of a horse (between a walk and a canter in speed) where the legs move in diagonal pairs alternately. (4)

3 The turnaround by a swimmer at the end of the pool following each lap. (4)
