


Sports _Rowing_ 13x13_ 2008-10-19



Across

- 1 Aholder attached to the gunwale of a boat that holds the oar in place and acts as a fulcrum for rowing. (3,4)
- 6 Side of the boat to the coxswain's right and to the rower's left. (9)
- 8 Bad technique that slows down the boat. (5)
- 9 The rear part of a boat. (5)
- 11 Quick run during the last part of the race usually the last 500 meters. (6)

12 End of the boat closest to the direction of travel. (3)

13 A stroke of the oar that either misses the water or digs too deeply. (4)

14 Also called finish. (7)

3 The part of the stroke where the oar enters the water. (5)

4 The part of the boat where the shoes are attached and where the rower pushes his legs against on the drive. (4,9)

9 One full motion of oar to move a boat. (6)

10 Extent to which you lean back at the finish. (3,4)

11 A long oar used in an open boat. (5)

Down

- 1 A pole with flat blade used for rowing a boat through water. (3)
- 2 Part of the stroke where the rower comes back up the slide slowly toward the catch. (8)

5 The side of the boat to the coxswain's left and the rower's right. (4)

7 The distance the boat moves after a stroke. (3)

8 The helmsman of a ship's boat or a racing crew. (8)
