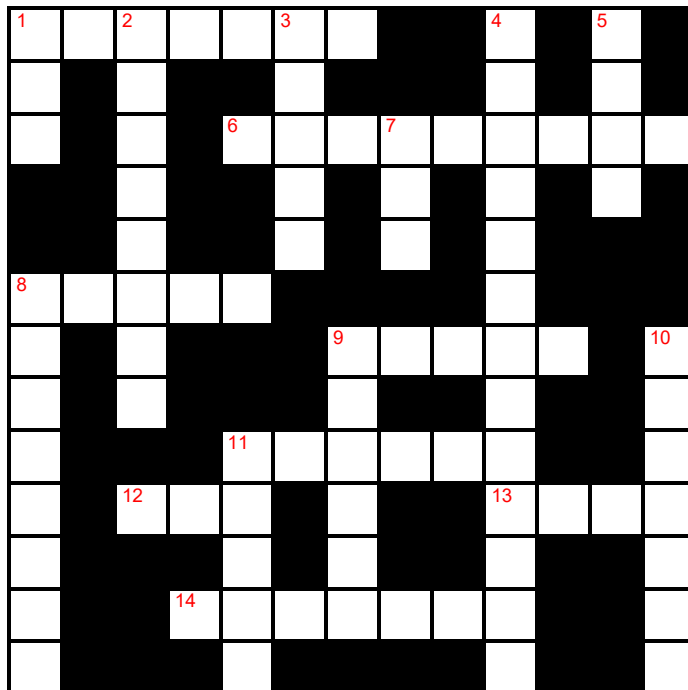

| <p><b>1</b> A holder attached to the gunwale of a boat that holds the oar in place and acts as a fulcrum for rowing. (3,4)</p> | <p><b>12</b> End of the boat closest to the direction of travel. (3)</p>                                  | <p><b>3</b> The part of the stroke where the oar enters the water. (5)</p>  | <p><b>9</b> One full motion of oar to move a boat. (6)</p>           |
| <p><b>6</b> Side of the boat to the coxswain's right and to the rower's left. (9)</p>  | <p><b>13</b> A stroke of the oar that either misses the water or digs too deeply. (4)</p>                 | <p><b>4</b> The part of the boat where the shoes are attached and where the rower pushes his legs against on the drive. (4,9)</p> | <p><b>10</b> Extent to which you lean back at the finish. ( 3,4)</p> |
| <p><b>8</b> Bad technique that slows down the boat. ( 5)</p>   | <p><b>14</b> Also called finish. (7)</p>  | <p><b>5</b> The side of the boat to the coxswain's left and the rowers right. (4)</p>   | <p><b>11</b> A long oar used in an open boat. (5)</p>                |
| <p><b>11</b> Quick run during the last part of the race usually the last 500 meters. (6)</p>                                   | <p><b>2</b> Part of the stroke where the rower comes back up the slides slowly towards the catch. (8)</p> | <p><b>7</b> The distance the boat moves after a stroke. ( 3)</p>  | <p><b>8</b> The helmsman of a ship's boat or a racing crew. (8)</p>  |
