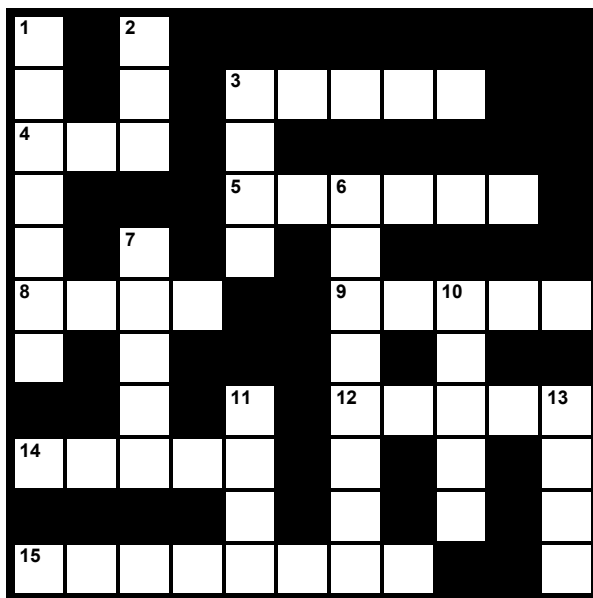

| <p>3 A bat without any covering. (5)</p> <p>4 Six inches high strip of netting dividing the table into two equal parts. (3)</p> <p>5 A ball with a great deal of spin. (6)</p> <p>8 A long sweeping upward motion that just grazes the ball and puts tremendous spin on it. (4)</p> <p>9 Nine feet long and five feet wide with playing surface at a height of 2 feet, 6 inches above the floor. (5)</p> <p>12 A ball landing near the net. (5)</p> <p>14 A formal contest</p> | <p>in which two or more persons or teams compete. (5)</p> <p>15 Trade name of the game resembling tennis but played on a table with paddles and a light hollow ball. (4, 4)</p> <h3>Down</h3> <p>1 This kind of grip gives a player the best forehand but a much weaker backhand. (7)</p> <p>2 A serve that strikes the net before falling into the receiver's court; the ball must be served again. (3)</p> <p>3 Made of celluloid or</p> | <p>similar plastic material (38 mm in diameter and weighing 2.5 gms). (4)</p> <p>6 A rubber sheet on the bat having a very low friction coefficient. (8)</p> <p>7 A specially marked area within which a game is played. (5)</p> <p>10 The bat is held in front of the ball with little movement at the point of contact. (5)</p> <p>11 To force the opponent to hit the ball into the net. (4)</p> <p>13 Consists of two or three members where each player</p> | <p>competes against every other player on an opposing team.
