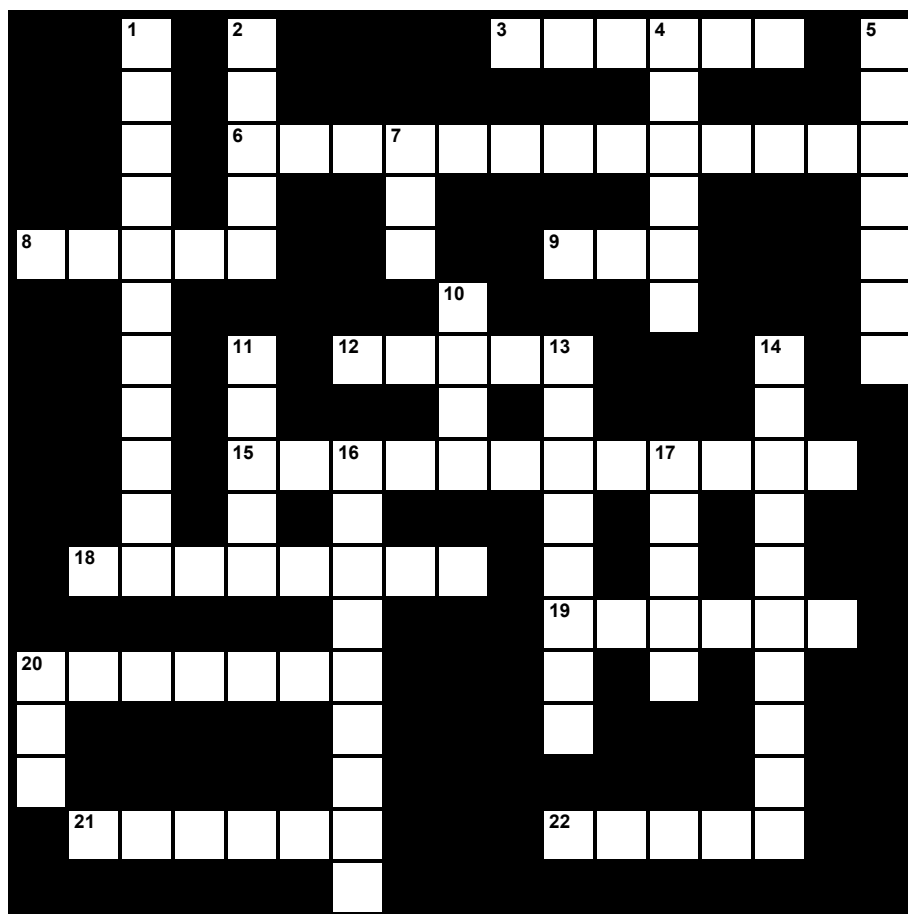

Across

- 3** Also called "spiker" or "attacker." (6)
- 6** The flexed, yet comfortable, posture a player assumes before moving to the point of contact. (5,8)
- 8** Also hit or attack. (5)
- 9** Also called "spike" or "attack." (3)
- 12** A ball that is deflected back to the attacking team's floor by the opponent's blockers. (5)
- 15** Any ball spiked with less than maximum force but with spin. (3-5,4)
- 18** Area between attack line and back line. (4,4)

- 19** Attempt to hit the ball to the floor on the opponent's side. (6)
- 20** Occurs when the receiving team successfully puts the ball away against the serving team, or when the serving team commits an unforced error, and the receiving team thus gains the right to serve. (4-3)
- 21** Last name of William G., the inventor of Volleyball game. (6)
- 22** The field of play. (5)

Down

- 1** An area of 10 feet by 10 feet on right side behind each back line. (7,4)

- 2** Putting the ball into play. (5)
- 4** Width of the court in feet. (6)
- 5** A one-hand floor defensive technique where the hand is extended and slid along the floor palm down while the player dives or extension rolls, so that the ball bounces off the back of the hand. (7)
- 7** Slang for the art of retrieving an attacked ball close to the floor. (3)
- 10** Descriptive slang for forearm passing. (4)
- 11** The combination of one, two or three players jumping in front of the opposing spiker and contacting

the spiked ball with the hands. (5)

- 13** Any ball that the opponent returns easily. (4,4)
- 14** An individual shot directed at an angle from one end of the offensive team's side of the net to the opposite sideline of the defensive team's court. (5-5)
- 16** The area between centre line and attack line. (5,4)
- 17** Length of the court in feet. (5)
- 20** The tactical skill in which a ball is directed to a point where a player can spike it into the opponent's court. (3)
