

- 1 Sets of parallel slats in a door or window to admit air and reject rain (4)
- 3 A roof in the form of a dome (6)
- 6 A prefix referring to earth
- 7 A Greek-style column topped by a single scroll just below the top (5)
- 8 Also called altarpiece (7)
- 10 Any shape that is triangular in cross section (5)
- 12 Railing at the side of a staircase or balcony (10)
- 17 The curved or pointed top on a door or open entryway (4)

18 A covered passageway; often between streets with shops or stalls (6)

- 19 Of or relating to or characteristic of Tuscany or its people (6)
- 21 A style of architecture developed in Italy and western Europe between the Roman and the Gothic styles after 1000 AD (10)
- 22 The underside of a part of a building (such as an arch or overhang or beam etc.). (6)
- 23 Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window (6)
- 24 A rectangular channel cut into a board so that another like piece may be fitted into it (4)

- 1 A buttress that stands apart from the main structure and connected to it by an arch (6,8)
- 2 An object with S-shaped section; a.k.a. cyma reversa (4)
- 3 Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns (9)
- 4 A plain plinth that supports a wall (5)
- 5 A triangular bracket of brick or stone (6)
- 7 Concept that exists in the mind (4)
- 9 Projecting mouldings on the underside of a vault or ceiling; may be ornamental or structural (4)
- 11 A style of architecture
- 13 Having straight horizontal beams or lintels (rather than arches) (9)
- 14 Relating or belonging to the countries of Asia as viewed from Europe or America (7)
- 15 Any vertical post or rod used as a support (9)
- 16 Molten rock below the surface of the earth (5)
- 20 Partition consisting of a decorative frame or panel that serves to divide a space (6)
