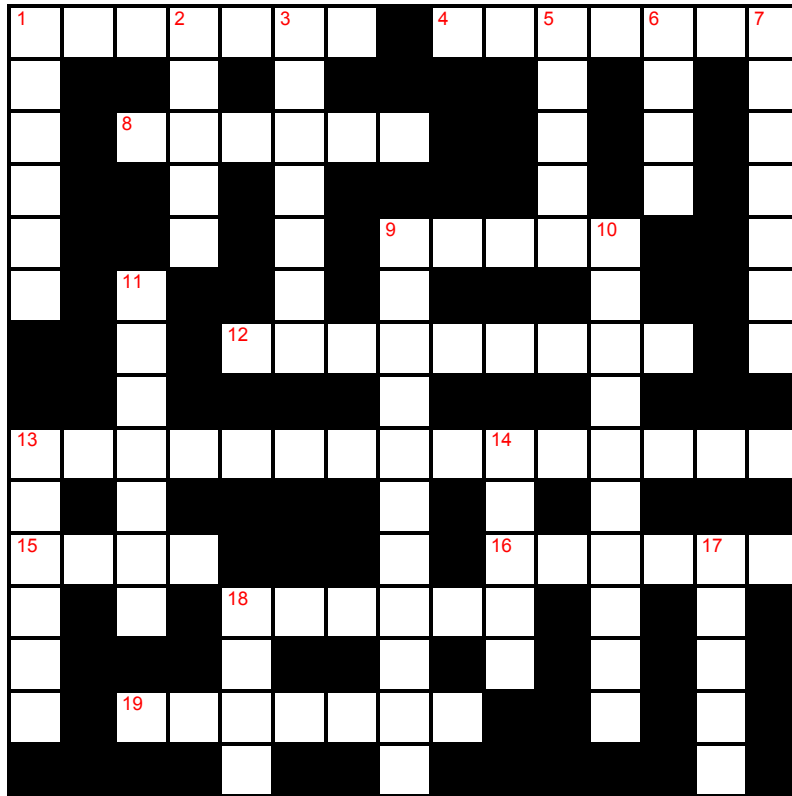

### Across

- 1 Small opening (like a window in a door) through which business can be transacted (7)
- 4 Small, usually rectangular or fanlight window over a door (7)
- 8 A very small, slender tower (6)
- 9 The underpart of a sloping roof overhanging a wall (5)
- 12 An apartment located on the top floors of a building (9)
- 13 Stone, brick or tile work in which the components are laid diagonally instead of horizontally, forming a distinctive zigzag pattern along a wall face (7,4,4)

- 15 The curved or pointed top on a door or open entryway (4)
- 16 A covering (usually of cloth) that serves as a roof to shelter an area from the weather (6)
- 18 A roof covering of straw, reeds or even living grass (6)
- 19 A porch along the outside of a building (sometimes partly enclosed) (7)

### Down

- 1 Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window (6)
- 2 A framework of beams forming a rigid structure (as a roof truss) (5)

- 3 A moulding at the corner between the ceiling and the top of a wall (7)
- 5 Unburnt brick dried in the sun (5)
- 6 Structural member consisting of a continuous horizontal timber forming the lowest member of a framework or supporting structure (4)
- 7 A vertical post that divides a window into two or more panes (7)
- 9 The structure consisting of the part of a classical temple above the columns between a capital and the roof (11)
- 10 Windows with a sliding frame (4,6)
- 11 Usually paved outdoor

area adjoining a residence (7)

- 13 A brick laid in a wall so that only its end appears on the face of the wall (6)
- 14 A recess in a wall especially for a statue. Usually curved at the back (5)
- 17 Usually paved outdoor area adjoining a residence (5)
- 18 A flat thin rectangular slab (as of fired clay or rubber or linoleum) used to cover surfaces (4)
