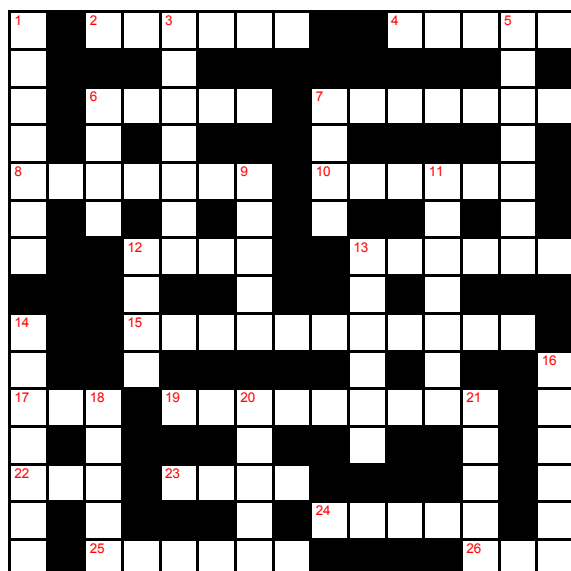

- 2 A boat for carrying mail (6)
- 4 Any of various small boats propelled by oars or by sails or by a motor (5)
- 6 A deep ravine (usually with a river running through it) (5)
- 7 A French lug-rigged boat of the chassemaree type (7)
- 8 A type of ships from the Age of Sail (7)
- 10 A type of Chinese sailing boat exemplified by the Vung Tau shipwreck (6)
- 12 A sailing boat originating from Micronesia similar to an outrigger canoe (4)
- 13 A ship engaged in whale fishing (6)
- 15 Ship equipped to detect and then destroy or neutralize or remove marine mines (4,7)

- 17 A boat built by Noah to save his family and animals from the flood (3)
- 19 Underwater boat (9)
- 22 A sailing vessel characterized by a single mast carried well forward (i.e., near the front of the boat) (3)
- 23 A narrow flat-bottomed fishing boat with high sides (4)
- 24 Strong lightweight wood used for floats (5)
- 25 A single-masted fishing smack used off the coast of Ireland (6)
- 26 A powerful small boat designed to pull or push larger ships (3)

- 1 A boat or barge used mainly for clearing or deepening waterways (7)

- 3 Steamship line, responsible for transporting goods (7)
- 5 Sailing ship equipped for war (7)
- 6 A part of sea extending into the land (4)
- 7 The main body of ship, which floats on water. (4)
- 9 Water boats and ships played a major role in development of international _____ (5)
- 11 Also known as Chinese shoe-boats, it is a common native craft sometimes with a sail, used for fishing and short range transportation. (7)
- 12 A machine that moves water in or out of something (4)
- 13 Light rowboat for use in racing or for transporting goods and passengers in inland waters and

harbours (6)

- 14 A small fishing vessel or pilot boat, used in the rivers of Portugal. It is sharp forward, having its stem bent above into a great curve, and plated with iron. (4-3)
- 16 The act of propelling with oars as a sport (6)
- 18 A sailing vessel with two masts; the mizzen is forward of the rudderpost (5)
- 20 A boat with a flat bottom for carrying heavy loads (especially on canals) (5)
- 21 A German torpedo boat used in World War II (1-4)
