

Across

- 1 A long narrow sandy island (wider than a reef) running parallel to the shore. (7,6)
- 7 Muddiness created by stirring up sediment or having foreign particles suspended. (9)
- 9 Discoloration of surface waters, most frequently in COASTAL ZONES, caused by large concentrations of microorganisms. (3,4)
- 10 Wet spongy ground of decomposing vegetation. (3)
- 11 The condition of the water surface when there is no wave or swell. (4)
- 13 A low triangular area where a river divides before entering a larger body of water. (5)
- 14 A very fine-grained soil that is plastic when moist but hard when fired. (4)
- 15 That strip of ground bordering any body of water which is alternately exposed, or covered by tides and/or waves. (5)
- 16 A submerged ridge of rock or coral near the surface of the water. (4)
- 17 A platform built out from the shore into the water and supported by piles; provides access to ships and boats. (4)

Down

- 1 XXXXXXXX Scale: An international scale of wind force from 0 (calm air) to 12 (hurricane). (8)
- 2 A stretch of turbulent water in a river or the sea caused by one current flowing into or across another current. (3)
- 3 Of or relating to the littoral area above the low-tide mark. (10)
- 4 A narrow channel of the sea joining two larger bodies of water. (6)
- 5 A narrow elongated projecting strip of land. (4)
- 6 A wave that is blown by the wind so its crest is broken and appears white. (8)
- 7 A huge destructive wave. (5,4)
- 8 The tide when the water is highest. (4,5)
- 12 A projecting ridge on a mountain or submerged under water. (5)
