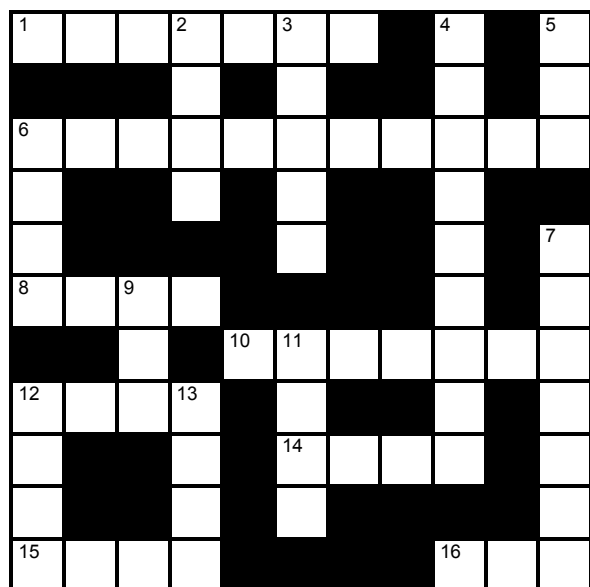

- 1 A town in north central France noted for white Burgundy wines. (7)
- 6 A French liqueur originally made by Benedictine monks. (11)
- 8 Japanese alcoholic beverage made from fermented rice; usually served hot. (4)
- 10 Alcoholic beverage that is distilled rather than fermented. (7)
- 12 Made from residue of grapes or apples after pressing. (4)

- 14 Pinkish table wine from red grapes whose skins were removed after fermentation began. (4)

- 15 An alcoholic drink made from the aromatic roots of the kava shrub. (4)
- 16 Whiskey distilled from rye or rye and malt. (3)

Down

- 2 An alcoholic drink, which is flavoured with hops. (4)
- 3 Whiskey made in Ireland chiefly from barley. (5)
- 4 Pale yellowish wine made from white grapes or red grapes with skins removed before

fermentation. (5,4)

- 5 Fermented alcoholic beverage similar to but heavier than beer. (3)

- 6 Pale Ale, which was once the highest selling beer in the UK. (4)

- 7 German white wine from the Moselle valley or a similar wine made elsewhere. (7)

- 9 A mixture of white wine and cassis. (3)

- 11 Sweet dark-red dessert wine originally from Portugal. (4)

- 12 The liquid inside a coconut or the sap of some trees. (4)

- 13 Spanish sparkling

white wine similar to champagne. (4)
