

- 1 A disease (common in India and around the Mediterranean area) caused by a rickettsia that is transmitted to humans by a reddish brown tick (ixodid) that lives on dogs and other mammals. Also called boutonneuse fever. (6,4)
- 4 Nervous excitement of an inexperienced hunter. (4)
- 6 A serious contagious viral disease of central western Africa; characterized by fever and inflammation and muscular pains and difficulty swallowing. (5)
- 8 Caused by rickettsial

bacteria and transmitted by wood ticks. (8)

- 9 A highly infectious animal disease (especially cattle and sheep); it can be transmitted to people. (7)
- 12 An atypical pneumonia caused by a rickettsia microorganism and transmitted to humans from infected birds. (6)
- 13 Marked by pain in muscles and joints and transmitted by lice. (6)
- 15 A mild viral disease transmitted by the bite of the sand fly Phlebotomus papatasii. Also called

pappataci fever. (7)

- 2 Leishmaniasis of the viscera; also called Dum-dum fever. (5)
- 3 Severe form of malaria occurring in tropical regions. (6)
- 4 Meningitis caused by bacteria and often fatal. (5)
- 5 An acute feverish disease in people and in dogs marked by gastroenteritis and mild jaundice. (8)
- 7 A fit of shivering. (4)
- 9 Any of several severe febrile diseases characterized by skin rashes or spots on the skin. (7)
- 10 Rickettsial disease transmitted by body lice and characterized by skin rash and high fever. (6)
- 11 An infectious disease of the tropics transmitted by mosquitoes and characterized by rash and aching head and joints. Also called breakbone fever and dengue fever. (5)
- 14 A seasonal rhinitis resulting from an allergic reaction to pollen. Also called pollinosis. (3)
