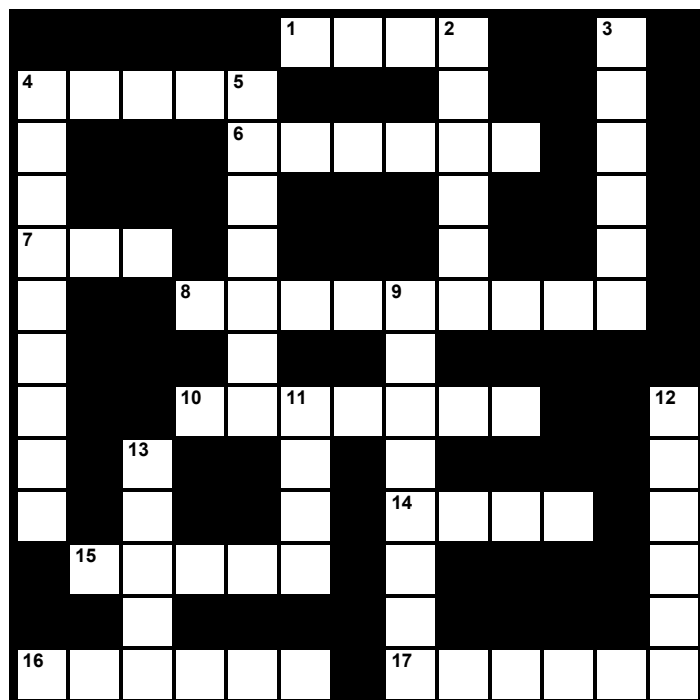

Across

- 1 The main line of growth in a plant, e.g., the stem, from which the other parts such as the leaves and flowers grow. (4)
- 4 A minute epidermal pore in a leaf or stem through which gases and water vapour can pass. (5)
- 6 A simple pistil or one element of a compound pistil. (6)
- 7 A partially opened flower. (3)
- 8 A plant which is adapted to live on a

limited supply of moisture. (9)

- 10 Of or pertaining to a genus. (7)
- 14 The upper angle between an axis and an offshoot such as a branch or leafstalk. (4)
- 15 An indeterminate inflorescence bearing sessile flowers on an unbranched axis. (5)
- 16 The fine spores that contain male gametes and that are borne by an anther in a flowering plant. (6)
- 17 A plant which is the offspring of

parents of different species. (6)

- 2 The tubular base of the leaf surrounding the flower spike. (6)
- 3 Usually elongate cluster of flowers along the main stem in which the flowers at the base open first. (6)
- 4 Living together of dissimilar organisms with benefit to both. (9)
- 5 Grown together (7)
- 9 Collective term for the outer parts of a flower consisting

of the calyx and corolla and enclosing the stamens and pistils. (8)

- 11 A joint or knot. (4)
- 12 Arranged on one side only, as flowers or leaves on a stalk. (6)
- 13 The outermost whorl of flower parts. (5)
