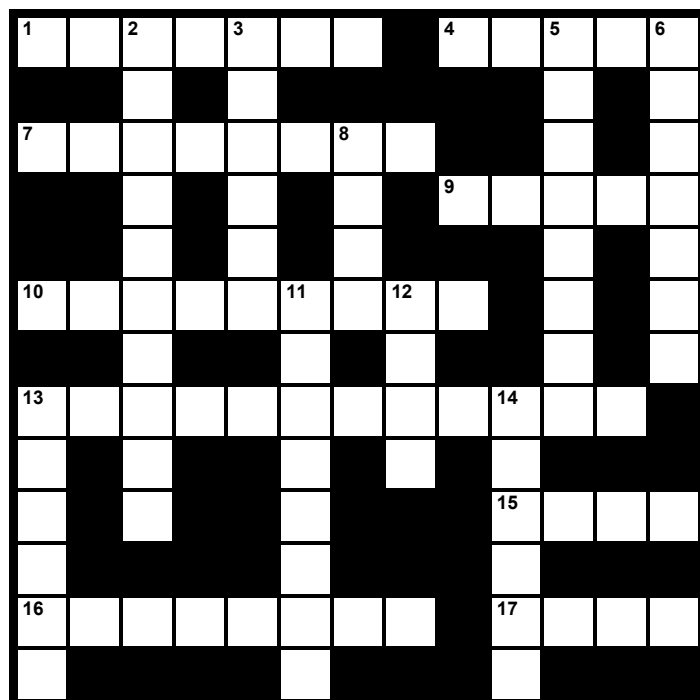

Across

- 1 A fabric lamination on the inside of a material to give it required strength and wearing comfort. (7)
- 4 Cords that are drawn through eyelets in order to tie a shoe. (5)
- 7 DIN stands for XXXXXXXX Industrie Norm - German equivalent of British Standard. (8)
- 9 CAD stands for Computer XXXXX Design. (5)
- 10 Shoe constructed in a manner that the sole is attached

to the upper and insole by a single chain-stitched seam; no welt is used. (5-4)

- 13 A moulding process that enables complex designs in leather uppers to be copied in PVC very cheaply. (4,8)
- 15 Part of the shoe under the heel of the foot. (4)
- 16 A synthetic rubber, polychloroprene, developed by Du Pont, used as adhesive in shoemaking. (8)

- 17 Leather made from the skin of a young bovine animal. (4)

- 2 A boot reaching halfway up to the knee. (6,4)
- 3 The inner sole of a shoe or boot. (6)
- 5 A fine leather originally made in Cordoba, Spain. (8)
- 6 Generic terms for imitation suede. (7)
- 8 The dressed skin of an animal (especially a large animal). (4)
- 11 A wooden or metal device that is

inserted into a shoe to preserve its shape when it is not being worn. (4,4)

- 12 A raised or strengthened seam. (4)
- 13 Stitching of an ornamental piece of leather on top of the quarters. (6)
- 14 A cover of synthetic material or even leather cemented to the insole after the shoe is made to hide tacks or stitches and present a clean, even appearance. (6)
