

- 1 A method of organizing the manufacturing processes so that raw materials, components and sub-assemblies arrive just-in-time at the required point of manufacture. (3)
- 2 Surface texture of leather characteristic of the animal concerned. (5)
- 4 To trim down the edges of leather. (5)
- 7 Matching contours of the bottom surface of the foot. (4,4)
- 10 A material that softens when heated and hardens again when cooled. (13)
- 11 The dressed skin of an animal (especially a large animal). (4)
- 12 It holds the sandal on foot by means of a loop round the big toe. Basically an

Indian design. (3,4)

- 13 The fleshy part of the foot just back of the toes (metatarsal heads). Also called a joint. (4)
- 17 The branch of medicine concerned with the feet. (9)
- 18 Having the property of becoming permanently hard and rigid when heated or cured. (13)
- 20 Shoes designed originally for sports training; have a fabric upper with a leather trim in a lace up style. Sole is generally either moulded PVC or cemented EVA. Also called trainers. (7)

- 1 The fleshy part of the foot just back of the toes (metatarsal heads). Also called ball. (5)
- 3 This technology involves integrated use of CAD/CAM and robotics to produce goods more cheaply and efficiently. (3)
- 5 A cover of synthetic material or even leather cemented to the insole after the shoe is made to hide tacks or stitches and present a clean, even appearance. (6)
- 6 The tendency of a body to return to its original shape after it has been stretched or compressed. (10)
- 7 A holding pattern shaped like a human foot that is used to fashion or repair shoes. (5)

- 8 Very light heelless shoe with upper of soft fabric, designed for dancing. (6,4)
- 9 An undesired change in colour. (13)
- 12 Any protrusion of leather from the vamp. (3)
- 13 A women's footwear style, having an upper (made of soft & flexible material) extending slightly above the ankle. (6)
- 14 Cords that are drawn through eyelets in order to tie a shoe. (5)
- 15 The flap of material under the laces of a shoe or boot; an extension of the vamp over the instep. (6)
- 16 Disability of walking due to crippling of the legs or feet. (4)
- 19 Part of the shoe under the heel of the foot. (4)
