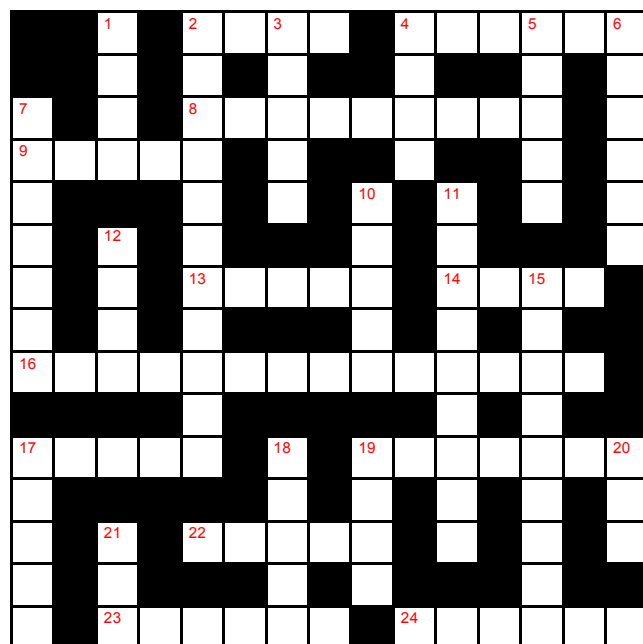

- 2 A fleshy fruit (apple or pear or related fruits) having seed chambers and an outer fleshy part. (4)
- 4 Also known as Key fruit. (6)
- 8 A quince. A kind of peach having one side deep red, and the flesh yellow. (9)
- 9 A small oval bitter fruit, green when unripe and black when ripe, that yields olive oil. (5)
- 13 Fruit of the oak tree. (5)
- 14 A small hard fruit. (4)
- 16 A somewhat flat reddish-orange loose skinned citrus of China. (8,6)
- 17 Dried plum. (5)
- 19 Mexican black cherry. (7)
- 22 Mulberries: Type genus of the Moraceae. (5)
- 23 A large spherical or

elongated fruit with yellow pulp and numerous seeds, eaten fresh or in salads and desserts. (6)

24 Dried grape. (6)

- 1 Small deciduous Asiatic tree bearing large red or orange edible astringent fruit. (4)
- 2 Large globular fruit having many seeds with juicy red pulp in a tough brownish-red rind. (11)
- 3 Any fruit of the gourd family having a hard rind and sweet juicy flesh (5)
- 4 A thorny Eurasian bush with plumlike fruits. (4)
- 5 Also known as earthnut. (5)
- 6 An edible, oval-shaped, brown-skinned nut that is widely used in cooking. (6)

7 Fruit of the wild plum of southern US. (3-4)

10 *Mangifera indica*. (5)

11 Fragrant oval yellowish tropical fruit used in jellies and confections. (4,5)

12 ____ melon: Small green-skinned melon. (4)

15 Large fruits with shiny purple skin, eaten cooked as a vegetable. (9)

17 A fruit that is not cheap. (5)

18 Any of numerous small and pulpy edible fruits; used as desserts or in making jams and jellies and preserves. (5)

19 Hard fibrous outer layer of some fruits especially nuts. (4)

20 Usually large hard-shelled seed. (3)

21 The dried flowers used in brewing, to add

flavour to beer. (3)
