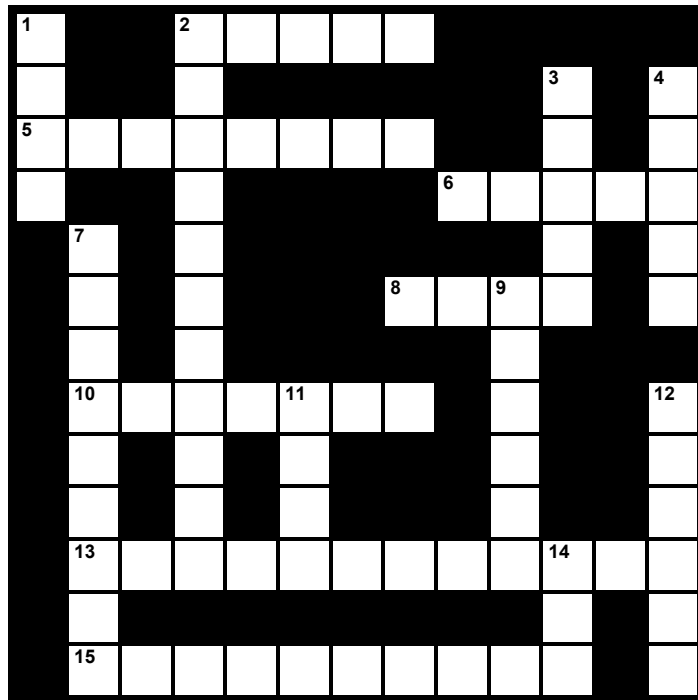

- 2 Oil-secreting gland situated at the base of the tail in most birds. (5)
- 5 Any of the glands in the eyes that secrete tears. (8)
- 6 One of a pair of glands (believed to have excretory functions) in some crustaceans near the base of the large antennae. (5)
- 8 A gland that secretes externally through a duct. (4)
- 10 A large salivary gland that produces 50% of daytime saliva; in human beings it is located in front of and below each ear. (7)
- 13 Any of the glands in the skin that secrete perspiration. (12)
- 15 Either of a pair of complex endocrine glands situated near the kidney. (10)
- 2 Any one of four endocrine glands situated above or within the thyroid gland. (11)
- 3 Any of the glands in the skin that secrete perspiration. (5)
- 4 A gland (often a protuberance or depression) that secretes nectar. (5)
- 7 A small endocrine gland in the brain; situated beneath the back part of the corpus callosum; secretes melatonin. (9)
- 9 Gland by the name of its discoverer, a English Surgeon. (6)
- 11 Any of the glands in the eyes that secrete tears. (4)
- 12 A long sebaceous gland that lubricates the eyelids. (6)
- 14 A gland that secretes oil. (3)

- 1 Silk-producing gland of insects (especially of a silkworm) or spiders. (4)
