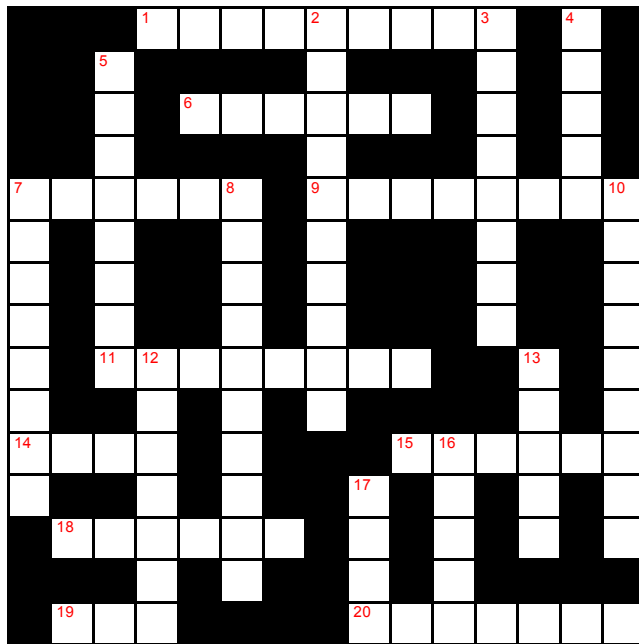

Across

- 1 Any gland having ducts that pour secretions into the digestive tract. (9)
- 6 Gland by the name of its discoverer, a English Surgeon. (6)
- 7 Any of several lymph nodes in the walls of the intestines near the junction of the ileum and colon. (6)
- 9 (of exocrine glands) producing a secretion in which part of the secreting cell is released with the secretion. (8)
- 11 Any of three pairs of glands in the mouth and digestive system that secrete saliva for digestion. (8)
- 14 Any of the glands in the eyes that secrete tears. (4)
- 15 A ductless glandular organ at the base of the neck that produces lymphocytes and aids in

producing immunity; atrophies with age. (6)

- 18 A small endocrine gland in the brain; situated beneath the back part of the corpus callosum; secretes melatonin. (6)
- 19 A gland that secretes oil. (3)
- 20 Located near the base of the neck. (7)

Down

- 2 Either of a pair of complex endocrine glands situated near the kidney. (10)
- 3 A gland that secretes externally through a duct. (8)
- 4 Oil-secreting gland situated at the base of the tail in most birds. (5)
- 5 Any of the glands of the endocrine system that secrete hormones directly into the bloodstream. (8)

- 7 A firm partly muscular chestnut sized gland in males at the neck of the urethra; produces a viscid secretion that is the fluid part of semen. (8)
- 8 A small salivary gland that produces mucin (the viscous component of saliva); in human beings it is located on either side of the mouth under the tongue. (10)
- 10 A small endocrine gland in the brain; situated beneath the back part of the corpus callosum; secretes melatonin. (9)
- 12 Either of a pair of complex endocrine glands situated near the kidney. (7)
- 13 The source of lymph and lymphocytes. (5)
- 16 A gland (often a protuberance or depression) that secretes nectar. (5)
- 17 A gland that secretes

externally through a duct. (4)
