

**Across**

- 1 A large piece of fabric (as canvas) by means of which wind is used to propel a sailing vessel. (4)
- 3 A vehicle carrying many passengers; used for public transport. (5)
- 5 Bright-coloured float attached by rope to the seabed to mark channels in a harbour or underwater hazards. (4)

- 7 Mechanical device that produces a force, or thrust, along the axis of rotation when rotated in a fluid, gas or liquid. (9)
- 11 A mechanical device that prevents a vessel from moving. (6)
- 14 A line of track providing a runway for wheels. (8)
- 15 A vessel for fishing; often has a well to keep the catch alive. (7,6)

**Down**

- 1 A vessel that carries passengers or freight across waters. (4)
- 2 Motorized bicycle. (5)
- 4 A system of conveying mail by aircraft. (7)
- 6 A craft capable of moving over water or land on a cushion of air created by jet engines. (10)
- 8 A tower with a light that gives warning of shoals to passing ships. (10)
- 9 A railway having a single track. (8)
- 10 A wheeled vehicle drawn by horses. (8)
- 12 An open way (generally public) for travel or transportation. (4)
- 13 A vertical spar for supporting sails, etc. (4)
