

## Across

- 1 Make a sound as if blown. (4)
- 3 Cousin of the sitar but longer at 5 ft 5 ins. (8)
- 8 Double ended drum traditionally used in weddings across the Indian subcontinent. (Dhokla) (6)
- 9 A portable box-shaped free-reed instrument; the reeds are made to vibrate by air from the bellows controlled by the player. (9)
- 10 Of heaven or spirit (e.g. melodies). (8)
- 11 An electronic simulation of a pipe organ. (5)
- 13 The distinctive property of a complex sound (a voice or noise or musical sound). (4)
- 14 A stringed instrument of India; has a long neck and movable frets; has 6 or 7 metal strings for playing and usually 13 resonating strings. (1s

## Art) (5)

- 16 A small thin device (of metal or plastic or ivory) used to pluck a stringed instrument. (8)
- 18 South Indian clay pot; classical percussion. (Ham Tag) (6)
- 19 Simple, stringed instrument, belonging to the category of zithers; struck with two hammers; similar to the cymbalon. (No Roast) (7)
- 20 Egg-shaped terra-cotta wind instrument with a mouthpiece and finger holes. (7)
- 21 Based on or using the five tones and two semitones of the major or minor scales of Western music. (8)
- 22 A vibrator consisting of a thin strip of stiff material that vibrates to produce a tone when air streams over it. (4)
- 23 The musical interval

between adjacent keys on a keyboard instrument. (8)

## Down

- 1 A group of musicians playing popular music for dancing. (4)
- 2 A musical interval of two semitones. (9)
- 4 A stringed instrument that has triangular body and three strings; national instrument of Russia. (9)
- 5 Wind instruments, where air is the primary vibrating agent causing sound. (10)
- 6 A percussion instrument with wooden bars tuned to produce a chromatic scale and with resonators; played with small mallets. (7)
- 7 A stringed instrument of the guitar family that has long neck and circular body. (5)
- 12 A rapid series of

ascending or descending notes on the musical scale. (9)

- 13 A set of two small tuned drums used in North Indian music. (Talab) (5)
- 14 Foremost bowed instrument in North Indian classical music; of one piece of wood with a goat skin sound table; no frets. (Rain Gas) (7)
- 15 Double-headed drum of Latin America; similar to bombo but wider shell. (Atom Bar) (7)
- 17 A wind instrument; the player blows air into a bag and squeezes it out through pipes. (7)
- 19 A series of notes differing in pitch according to a specific scheme (usually within an octave). (5)
