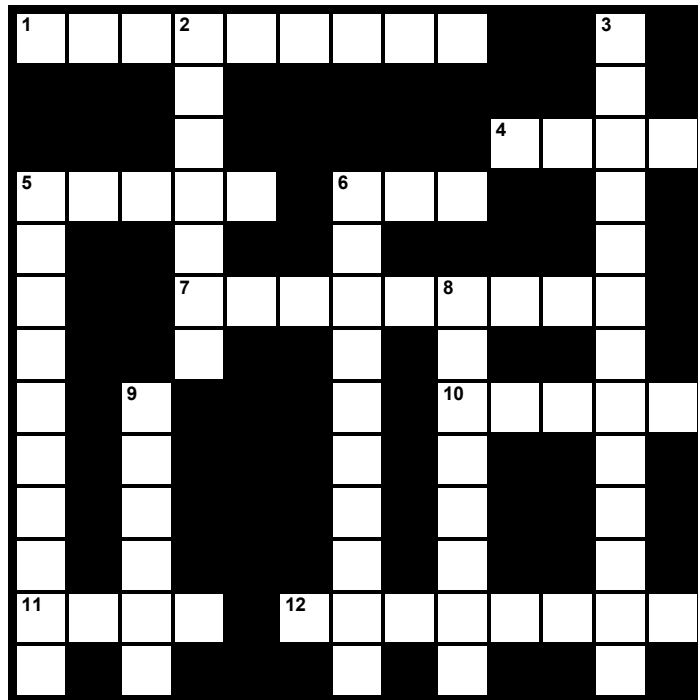

1 Of or relating to or found in estuaries. (9)

4 A terrace formed by wave action along the backshore of a beach. (4)

5 A long steep slope or cliff at the edge of a plateau or ridge; usually formed by erosion. (5)

6 An indentation of a shoreline larger than a cove but smaller than a gulf. (3)

7 The part of the seashore

between the high-water and low-water marks. (9)

10 A protective structure of stone or concrete; extends from shore into the water to prevent a beach from washing away. (5)

11 A ridge of sand created by the wind; found in deserts or near lakes and oceans. (4)

12 A natural elevation

(especially a rocky one that juts out into the sea). (8)

2 A strong upward air current. (7)

3 A long narrow sandy island (wider than a reef) running parallel to the shore. (7,6)

5 A greater than average tide occurring during the new and full moons. (6,4)

6 A protective structure of stone or

concrete; extends from shore into the water to prevent a beach from washing away. (10)

8 The tide when the water is highest. (4,4)

9 Elevated (e.g., mountainous) land. (6)
