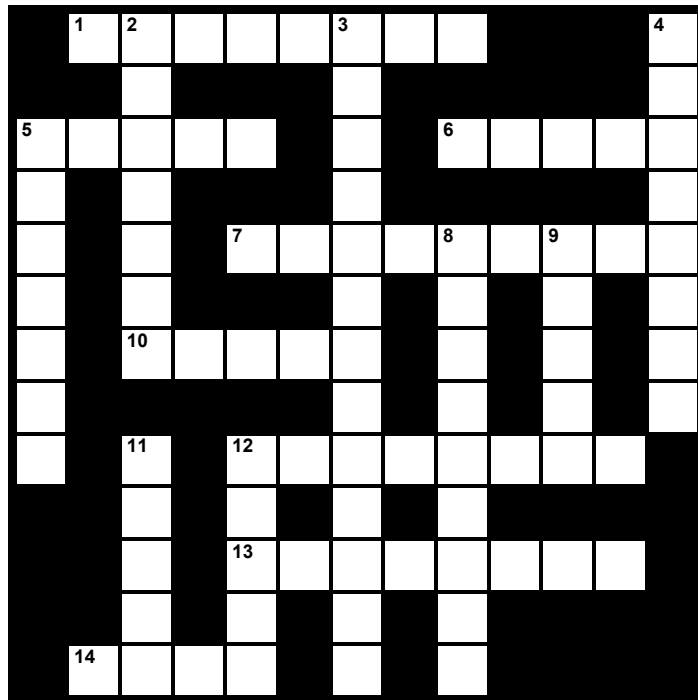

- 1 Pelagic snail whose foot is modified for swimming. (8)
- 5 Small usually single-celled reproductive body produced especially by certain bacteria and algae and fungi and nonflowering plants. (5)
- 6 Shrimp-like planktonic crustaceans. (5)
- 7 A community of organisms where each member is eaten in turn by another member. (4,5)
- 10 Marine colonial polyp characterized by a calcareous skeleton. (5)
- 12 Aquatic carnivorous mammal having a streamlined body specialized for swimming with limbs modified as flippers. (8)
- 13 Of or relating to a coastal or shore region. (8)
- 14 Large brown seaweeds having fluted leathery fronds. (4)

- 2 Of or relating to nutrition. (7)
- 3 Photosynthetic or plant constituent of plankton; mainly unicellular algae. (13)
- 4 Groups of organisms with specialized functions that form a coordinated unit. (8)
- 5 Permanently attached to a substrate; not free to move about. (7)
- 8 Terrestrial or aquatic flesh-eating mammal. (9)
- 9 Primitive chlorophyll-containing mainly aquatic eukaryotic organisms lacking true stems and roots and leaves. (5)
- 11 The status of an organism within its environment and community (affecting its survival as a species). (5)
- 12 One of two forms that coelenterates take e.g. a hydra or coral. (5)
