

- 2 Chief non-carbohydrate constituent of wood; its presence in paper is believed to contribute to chemical degradation. (6)
- 5 Art produced by decorating a surface with cutouts and then coating it with several layers of varnish or lacquer. (9)
- 7 A paper collage process in which sheets of paper are laminated together by the pressure of the etching press and

- 8 The continuous ribbon of paper, in its full width, during any stage of its progress through the paper machine. (3)
- 9 An instrument for measuring thickness between two points. (7)
- 12 A mixture of cellulose fibers. (4)
- 14 The gram weight of one square meter of paper. Also called grammage. (3)
- 15 A species of Spanish grass used for making paper (7)
