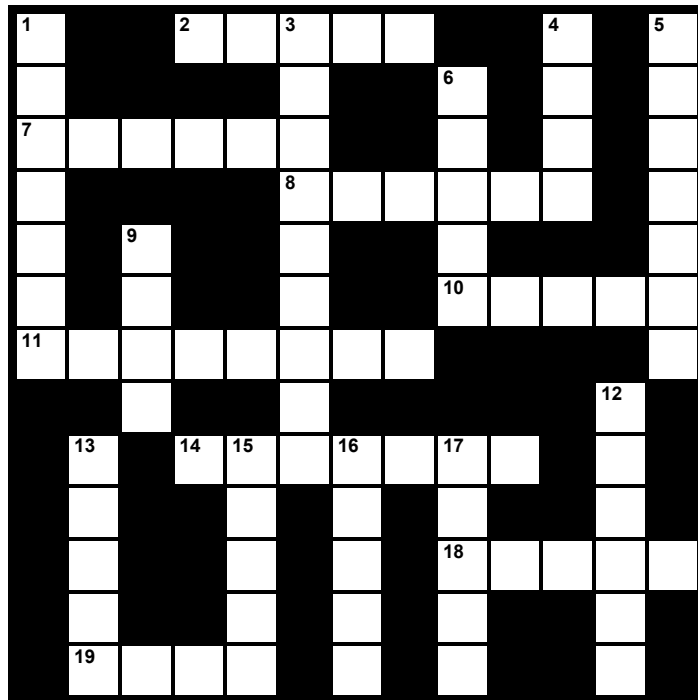

- 2 One of the green parts that form the calyx of a flower. (5)
- 7 A horizontal branch from the base of plant that produces new plants from buds at its tips. (6)
- 8 A plant that completes its entire life cycle within the space of a year. (6)
- 10 A fleshy underground stem or root serving for reproductive and food storage. (5)
- 11 Causing to grow together parts from different plants (8)
- 14 A mixture of decaying vegetation and manure; used as a fertilizer. (7)

- 18 A small body that contains the female germ cell of a plant; develops into a seed after fertilization. (5)

- 19 Water soaked soil; soft wet earth. (4)
