

- 8 K-GANA (Comb, one of the five physical symbols that a Khalsa Sikh must wear. It is a symbol of hygiene and discipline). (5)
- 9 A MAT (The soul which is considered immortal). (4)
- 11 TUSK ARM (A town in the Punjab where Forty Sikhs, known as 'Chaali Mukte' or the forty immortal ones, died in the battle against the Mughals in 1762).

- 14 GRAMS AT HAND (The book of writings of Guru Gobind Singh compiled after his death by Bhai Mani Singh and finished in 1734). (5,6)
- 17 RATIONAL SIKH (Collection of three hymns by Guru Nanak, one by Guru Ram Das and one by Guru Arjun Dev. It is recited as part of 'Nitnem' at bed time and also forms part of the funeral rites). (6,6)

10 DIG AD (The seat or throne of Guruship). (5)

12 IN PARK (Sword, one of the five physical symbols that a Khalsa Sikh must wear). (6)

13 A UI CHAP (A four line stanza used by some of the Gurus). (7)

15 MUTKI (Spiritual liberation from the cycles of birth and death). (5)

16 T-KHAT (A seat of Sikh authority). (5)
