

- 1 Any of various evergreen trees of the genus *Abies*; chiefly of upland areas. (3)
- 4 Edible kernel. (3)
- 7 A small group of trees. (5)
- 8 Shrubs or trees having toothed leaves and conelike fruit. (5)
- 9 Leguminous tree whose wood yields red dye. (5)
- 10 Slow-growing medium-sized cedar of east coast of USA. (5,7)
- 13 Any of various trees of the genus *Ulmus*; important timber or shade trees. (3)
- 14 Small tree of Central America and West Indies having bipinnate leaves and racemes of small bright yellow flowers and yielding a brown heartwood used in preparing a black dye.

- 16 Small trees of temperate and subtropical northern hemisphere having white flowers and berrylike fruit. (5)
- 17 North American hickory having loose grey shaggy bark and edible nuts. (5-4)
- 18 The liquid inside a coconut or the sap of some trees. (4)
- 21 An East Indian sapotaceous tree, whose timber is used for wagon wheels, and the flowers for food and in preparing an intoxicating drink. (5)
- 23 Large Californian tree. (7)
- 24 South American palm yielding a wax. (3,4)

- 2 An evergreen tree of California and Oregon, having reddish wood valued as timber. (3,3)
- 3 A thorny tree with compound leaves and pods containing a sweet pulp. Found in eastern North America. (5,6)
- 5 Evergreen bush with leaves that are dried to make beverage. (3)
- 6 Plant with edible pods and seeds. (4)
- 7 A dark greenish wood from a tropical American laurel. (5-5)
- 9 Yields a compact dark brown durable timber used in shipbuilding and making railway ties. (6)
- 10 Eurasian elm often planted as a shade tree. (5-3)
- 11 Small evergreen citrus tree that bears limes. (4)
- 12 Maple of eastern and central America; five-lobed leaves turn scarlet and yellow in autumn. (3,5)
- 15 Deciduous tree of the genus *Salix*; its wood is used to make cricket bats. (6)
- 19 A tree or bush belonging to a genus whose best-known member is the holly tree. (4)
- 20 Tropical tree with fronds. (4)
- 21 Thorny Eurasian shrub having dense clusters of white to scarlet flowers followed by deep red berries. (3)
- 22 A thorny bush or tree of rose family with white or pink flowers and reddish berries. (3)
