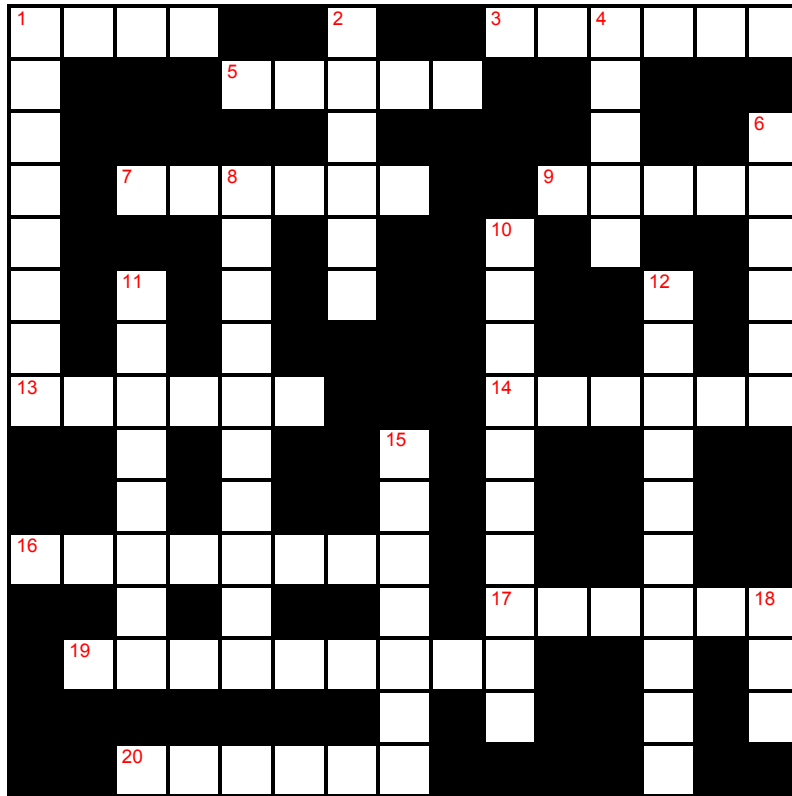

## Across

- 1 A fabric made of non-woven compressed matted animal fibers. (4)
- 3 A kind of stout woolen cloth with unfinished face and without raised nap. (6)
- 5 Thick woolen fabric used for clothing; originated in Scotland. (5)
- 7 Fabric made with yarn made from the silky hair of the Angora goat. (6)
- 9 A twilled woolen fabric. (5)
- 13 A cloth having a crisscross design. (6)
- 14 General term for

especially high quality fabrics of merino wool, usually used for coats and suits. (6)

- 16 A heavy fabric woven with chenille cord; used in rugs and bedspreads. (8)
- 17 A ribbed fabric used in clothing and upholstery. (6)
- 19 Lustrous, durable fabric with heavy crosswise ribs, used to make coats and suits. (9)
- 20 Rugged, water-repellent fabric made with a compact twill weave and tightly twisted worsted yarns. (6)

## Down

- 1 A very slender natural or synthetic fiber. (8)
- 2 Very fine wool from the Merino breed of sheep, used to make the finest of woolen and worsted cloths. (6)
- 4 Thick, fleecy coating fabric woven of coarser wools that are especially water repellent. (5)
- 6 Knitted fabric with fine lengthwise wales on the face and a plain back. (6)
- 8 A loosely woven coarse fabric of cotton or linen; used in clothing. (10)

- 10 Having very thin stripes. (10)
- 11 Small diamond pattern accentuated by a dot in the middle, resembling the eye of a bird. Commonly used in suitings. (5,3)
- 12 A densely textured woolen fabric with a lustrous finish. (10)
- 15 Hardy hornless sheep of the Cheviot hills noted for its wool. (7)
- 18 Soft, fuzzy surface produced on a fabric by brushing it to raise the fiber. (3)
