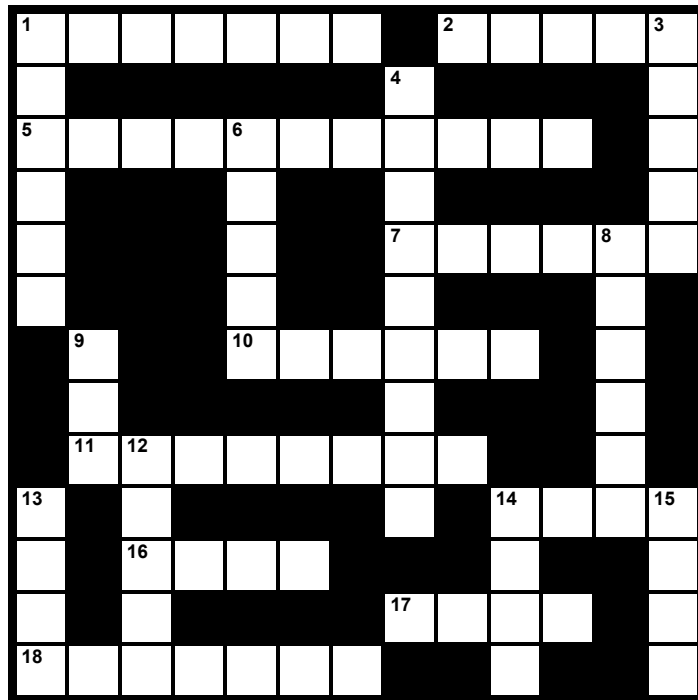

## Across

- 1 An apparatus for exposing something to the air (as sewage). (7)
- 2 Catch for fastening a door or gate; a bar that can be lowered or slid into a groove. (5)
- 5 A snake used to unblock toilets. (6,5)
- 7 An instrumentality invented for a particular purpose. (6)
- 10 A junction where two things (as paper or film or magnetic tape) have been joined together. (6)

## Down

- 11 A gas-driven power tool that digs soil trenches. (8)
- 14 A narrow thin strip of wood used as backing for plaster or to make latticework. (4)
- 16 Long thick piece of wood or metal or concrete, etc., used in construction. (4)
- 17 The amount of electrical current flowing in a circuit. (4)
- 18 A metal cap or band placed on a wooden pole to prevent splitting. (7)

## Down

- 1 A mechanical device that prevents a vessel from moving. (6)
- 3 A joint that holds two parts together so that one can swing relative to the other. (5)
- 4 Tool for tightening and loosening small nuts and bolts. (3,6)
- 6 The overhang at the lower edge of a roof. (5)
- 8 A cone-shaped chuck used for holding cylindrical pieces in a lathe. (6)

- 9 Electrically charged. (3)

- 12 Short for "reinforcing bar". (5)
- 13 A notch, channel, or slit made in any material by cutting or sawing. (4)
- 14 A short wire permanently attached to a receptacle or switch. (4)
- 15 A flexible pipe for conveying a liquid or gas. (4)
