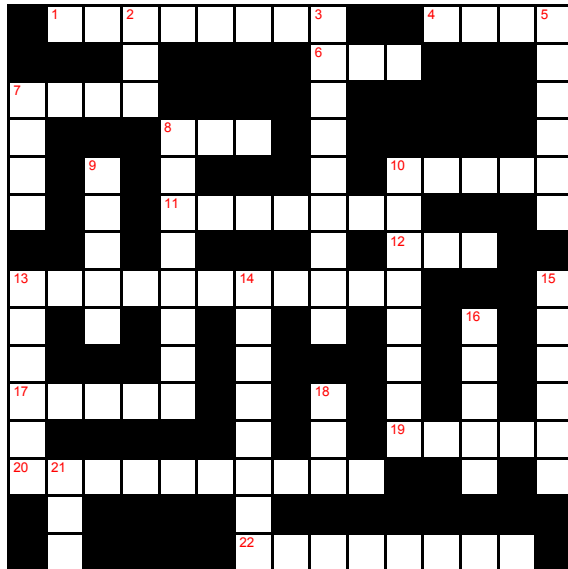

Across

- 1 An attractive deciduous tree; yellow-brown in autumn; yields a hard wood and edible nuts in a prickly bur. (8)
- 4 Plant structure which is the primary location for photosynthesis. (4)
- 6 Any of various deciduous pinnate-leaved ornamental or timber trees of the genus Fraxinus. (3)
- 7 Any plant of the family Palmae having an unbranched trunk crowned by large pinnate or palmate leaves. (4)
- 8 Any of various evergreen trees of the genus Abies; chiefly of upland areas. (3)
- 10 Any of numerous trees or shrubs of the genus Acer bearing winged seeds in pairs; north temperate zone.

- 11 Either of two huge coniferous California trees that reach a height of 300 feet. (7)
- 12 Any of various trees that are sources of gum. (3)
- 13 Transfer of pollen from the male to the female. (11)
- 17 Evergreen tree cultivated in the Mediterranean region since antiquity and now elsewhere; has edible shiny black fruits, important food and source of oil. (5)
- 19 Fruit with red or yellow or green skin and sweet to tart crisp whitish flesh. (5)
- 20 Dealing with form and structure. (10)
- 22 A hardwood tree that yields rosewood--valuable cabinet woods of a dark red or purplish color streaked and

variegated with black. (8)

- 2 A tree of the genus Ulmus: important timber or shade trees. (3)
- 3 Dealing with the description, classification and naming of organisms. (9)
- 5 Reproductive structure of a plant. (6)
- 7 A coniferous tree, with straight-grained durable and often resinous white to yellowish timber of any of numerous trees of the genus Pinus (4)
- 8 A cluster or bundle, usually referring to groups of needles in certain pines. (8)
- 9 Small , suppressed leaf as found in junipers, or the individual unit of a

cone under which the seeds may be found. (5)

- 10 Any shrub or tree of the genus Magnolia; valued for their longevity and exquisite fragrant blooms. (8)
- 13 Conducting tissue for products of photosynthesis. (6)
- 14 Needlelike. (8)
- 15 Any of various aromatic trees of the laurel family. (6)
- 16 A simple fleshy fruit which often has only one seed. (5)
- 18 Mediterranean tree widely cultivated for its edible fleshy sweet pear-shaped yellowish or purple multiple fruit. (3)
- 21 A deciduous tree of the genus Quercus; has acorns and lobed leaves. (3)
