

Across

- 1 Woody tropical grass having hollow woody stems; mature canes used for construction and furniture. (6)
- 2 Tree of the genus *Catalpa* with large leaves and white flowers followed by long slender pods; Indian beans. (7)
- 5 A coniferous tree, with straight-grained durable and often resinous white to yellowish timber of any of numerous trees of the genus *Pinus* (4)
- 6 Any of various trees of the genus *Ulmus*; important timber or shade trees. (3)
- 7 Fruit with red or yellow or green skin and sweet to tart crisp whitish flesh. (5)
- 10 Cultivated in temperate regions for downy juicy fruit with sweet



yellowish or whitish flesh. (5)

12 Any of various evergreen trees of the genus *Abies*; chiefly of upland areas. (3)

16 Any shrub or tree of the genus *Magnolia*; valued for their longevity and exquisite fragrant blooms. (8)

18 Any of

numerous evergreen conifers of the genus *Cupressus* of north temperate regions having dark scalelike leaves and rounded cones. (7)

20 Any betulaceous tree or shrub of the genus *Betula* having a thin peeling bark. (5)

21 Any of various deciduous trees of the genus *Tilia* heart-shaped leaves and drooping cymose clusters of yellowish often fragrant flowers; several yield valuable timber. (6)

23 Old World tree having sweet gritty-textured juicy fruit; widely cultivated in many varieties. (4)

25 Any of several North American trees of the genus *Populus* having a tuft of cottony hairs on the seed. (10)

26 Any of various trees of the genera *Eucalyptus* or *Liquidambar* or *Nyssa* that are sources of gum. (3)

27 Small deciduous tree of southern Africa having edible globular fruit with brown leathery skin and sweet-acid pithy flesh. (6)

28 Any of numerous trees and shrubs producing a small fleshy round fruit with a single hard stone; many also produce a valuable hardwood. (6)

29 A deciduous tree of the genus *Quercus*; has acorns and lobed leaves. (3)

30 Any plant of the family *Palmae* having an unbranched trunk crowned by large pinnate or palmate leaves. (4)

31 Any of several trees of the genus *Platanus* having thin pale bark that scales off in small plates and lobed leaves and ball-shaped heads of fruits. (8)

32 Any of several trees of the genus *Morus* having edible fruit that resembles the blackberry. (8)

Down

1 Any of several tropical and subtropical treelike herbs of the genus *Musa* having a terminal crown of large entire leaves and usually bearing hanging clusters of elongated fruits. (6)

3 Any of numerous trees of north temperate regions having light soft wood and flowers

4 Any of several large deciduous trees with rounded spreading crowns and smooth gray bark and small sweet edible triangular nuts enclosed in burs; north temperate regions. (5)

7 Any of various deciduous pinnate-leaved ornamental or timber trees of the genus *Fraxinus*. (3)

8 Any coniferous tree of the genus *Picea*. (6)

9 Any of several trees producing edible oval smooth-skinned fruit with a single hard stone. (4)

11 Any of several attractive deciduous trees yellow-brown in autumn; yield a hard wood and edible nuts in a prickly bur. (8)

12 Mediterranean tree widely cultivated for its edible fleshy sweet pear-shaped yellowish

borne in catkins. (6)

13 American hardwood tree bearing edible nuts. (7)

14 Large branching biennial herb native to Eurasia and Africa and adventive in North America having large fernlike leaves and white flowers; usually found in damp habitats; all parts extremely poisonous. (7)

15 Any of those hardwood trees of the genus *Dalbergia* that yield rosewood--valuable cabinet woods of a dark red or purplish color streaked and variegated with black. (8)

17 Asian tree having clusters of usually white blossoms and edible fruit resembling the peach. (7)

19 Any of several tropical trees of the genus *Diospyros* bearing orange fruit resembling a plum; edible

when fully ripe.
