


## Window Types 15x15 2006-09-09

### Across

- 1 A window outside an ordinary window to protect against severe weather or winter. (5)
- 3 The opening in a wall partition through which transactions in a financial institution take place. (6)
- 7 Ticket window or similar small opening. (7)
- 9 A circular window with ornamental tracery radiating in a symmetrical pattern from the centre. Also called wheel window. (4)
- 10 A window sash that is hinged (usually on one side). (8)
- 12 A window in the roof; for light. (4,5)

### Down

- 15 An opening (in a wall or ship or armoured vehicle) for firing through. (9)
- 18 The organ of sight. (6)
- 19 A small round window, especially a disk of thick glass in a ship's deck for letting in light below deck. (8)
- 20 The window in a gabled extension built to accommodate a window. (6)
- 21 A window in or under a gable. (5)
- 22 A semicircular window over a door or window; usually has sash bars like the ribs of a fan. (8)
- 2 A circular or oval window; 17th or 18th century French architecture. (4-2-5)
- 4 Fen \_\_\_\_\_ is a small opening covered with membrane (especially one in the bone between the middle and inner ear). (5)
- 5 A window with (usually two) sashes that slide vertically to let in air. (4)
- 6 A French door situated in an exterior wall of a building. (6)
- 7 Stained glass window, in shades of grey imitating the effect of relief. (9)
- 8 A circular window with ornamental tracery radiating in a symmetrical pattern from the centre. Also called rosace. (5)
- 11 Part of an interior wall rising above the adjacent roof with windows admitting light. (10)
- 13 Fenestra that has the base of the stapes attached to it. (4)
- 14 A window above a door that is usually hinged to a horizontal crosspiece over the door. (7)
- 16 It is one of two membranes that separates the inner ear from the middle ear. The oval window is the other. (5)
- 17 A window in a church depicting Jesus Christ's lineage from \_\_\_\_\_, the father of King David. (5)
- 18 A small window behind the rear side window of a motor car. (5)
